Letter from your Rector

Dear Parishioners,

As we enter the month of March we also enter the season of Lent as the preparation for Easter. This starts on Tuesday 4th March (pancake day) and we celebrate this with an open house for pancakes round at the Rectory in Aynho. Shrove Tuesday is followed by Ash Wednesday, when we will have two services with imposition of Ashes as tradition dictates. The mark of a cross is placed on your forehead as a sign of our mortality and repentance with the words 'remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return, repent of your sins and turn to Christ'. The Ashes used in this ceremony are made from burnt palm branches used at the previous year's Palm Sunday procession.

This will be followed by a Pancake Praise family time on Sunday 9th March at 4:30pm in Croughton Village Hall. Come along with the whole family for some fun, games and worship, including a helping of pancakes for the children.

Lent has traditionally been a time of abstinence or fasting, and if you are giving up something like chocolate or beer for Lent then why not give the money saved to charity or church, then you will have a double gain for the little bit of pain.

Around our 5 villages we will be holding our traditional Lent Bible Studies, to which everybody is welcome. These last for about an hour and involve lots of chat, biscuits and drinks. Please see details later in the newsletter for times and places.

Towards the end of Lent and the financial year, the church holds it annual elections for Churchwardens and PCC members, this is part of the governance of the local and then national church. To vote in these elections people need to have their name on the list of church members called the Electoral Role. Application forms and qualifying requirements can be found on the application forms in the churches.

The month of March ends this year on Mothering Sunday 30th March. All our churches will be holding Special Family Mothering Sunday Services suitable for the whole family. I hope that you will be able to come and pick up a small bunch of flowers to give as a token thank you for all that mothers do for our families.

ST.MICHAEL'S ANNUAL CHARITY SUPPORT - "BUNGOMA"

A link between the Anglican Diocese of Peterborough and Bungoma was formed by their two Bishops, the late Bishop Ian Candy and Bishop Eliud Wabukala – now Archbishop of the Anglican Church of Kenya" Around 30 individual churches and schools in our diocese are linked – supporting various projects.

Bungoma is a district of Kenya Western province close to the Uganda border with a population of around 20,000.

In addition to support from our Church, our **local school at Charlton** has links with a primary school in a village called WAMONO and here they have helped to build a well and school buildings. Primary schools like this take children up to 14 years. Most schools are bursting at the seams with not enough teachers, rooms or teaching and learning equipment.

THE BIODIVERSITY GROUP

As I sit here, writing the text for the March Newsletter, I am wondering if this very windy, wet weather will ever end. I am looking forward to March. "In like a lion and out like a lamb". The Spring Equinox on 21st March will herald the start of longer days and British Summer Time begins at the end of the month. Our wildlife, which has been in hibernation throughout the winter, will start to reappear: hedgehogs, grass snakes, frogs and toads will be on the move. An Unsung Hero - The Earthworm

There are four different groups of UK earthworm – **compost earthworms** – prefer warm moist environments with fresh compost – are bright red and stripy, **epigeic earthworm** – lives in top soil and leaf litter and do not make burrows are bright red or reddy-brown but not stripy, **endogeic earthworm** – live in and feed on soil - make horizontal burrows which can be very deep – are often pale colours, **anecic earthworm** – make permanent vertical burrows – feed on leaves which they drag into their burrows – largest UK species – are dark red or brown colour at head end.

An earthworm is a cold blooded animal which is covered in hairs and bristles to help it move. It doesn't have eyes but can sense light and dark along the length of its body. It breathes through its skin which must remain moist to

absorb oxygen. It does not have a heart but has 5 pairs of aortic arches which act in a similar way. It eats its own weight in live and dead organic matter every day and plays a vital role in mixing up the different soil layers and converting valuable nutrients into to a form that plants can use.

Worms are hermaphrodites but 2 worms are still needed to reproduce. They achieve sexual maturity after about 6 weeks and reproduce by laying tiny capsules. These can lie dormant in the soil for months or even years until conditions are right when between 2 and 10 small translucent pink worms will emerge. There are at least 25 species of British earthworm, ranging in length from 3cm to 12cm. Their average life span is 4-5 years although they can live for up to 10 years.

Did You Know?

- · Worms have existed for about 600 million years.
- · They are about 1,000 times stronger than people (relatively speaking, of course!).
- · There are about 3000 different types of earthworm globally.
- · One acre of land can contain around 1 million worms and these can break up about 50 tonnes of soil.
- Worms never over populate. They regulate their breeding actively in line with their environment, availability of food and space.
