



Bird of the Month Fieldfare

Fieldfares have a chestnut-brown back, and yellowy breast streaked with black, a black tail, dark wings and pale grey rump and head. Just a little smaller than the Mistle Thrush they are quite distinctive. As many as 750,000 birds spend the winter here arriving from Scandinavia in October and early November. They are very sociable birds and can be seen inflocks of anything from a dozen or so to several hundred roaming the



countryside. They usually feed on insects and worms in open fields but in severe weather move into gardens and orchards to feed on windfall apples and berries (rowan berries are a particular favourite). When the fruit runs low they move on often flying south and west across Britain. A Fieldfare spending the winter in Britain one year will not necessarily return the next winter but may instead overwinter in places like the Rhone and Po floodplains of France and Italy.

DID YOU KNOW

- The Fieldfare was once prized as a game bird? Many thousands were shot every year during their migrations, their meat being regarded as a delicacy.
- It aggressively defends its nest against egg and nestling thieves by bombarding them with its droppings.
- Smaller birds often nest close to the Fieldfare to benefit from some extra protection.



"How did the fitness class go" the doctor asked.


