

Rector's letter ~ The Coming of Easter

Easter this year comes early on 31st March and you may be wondering why I am mentioning that in February. But the simple reason is that the traditional 40 days of Lent, remembered before Easter, means that Lent this year starts in the middle of February, or on Ash Wednesday 13th February to be more precise which is foreshadowed by Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Day. Heather and I will be hosting an open house that evening (12th February 6pm-8pm at the Rectory, Aynho Court, Aynho) for those who don't want to cook their own pancakes. This is a fun time and everybody is welcome, but it would help if you could give us some clue if you are coming. Any donations given on the evening will go to charity.

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the marking in ashes of a cross on a person's forehead, signifying their turning from the wrong things in life (sin) and turning to Christ. It is also a reminder, if needed, about our mortality as the priest uses the words 'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.' The ashes used are made from the burnt remains of last year's palm crosses used on Palm Sunday. This year we will be holding both a morning and evening service to mark (if you pardon the pun) the occasion.

Lent for Christians is a time for preparing for Easter as we recall the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness. Historically this would mean going without luxuries and hence the using up of ingredients on Shrove Tuesday. Today some people still give up certain foods or activities as Lenten discipline. If you want to try this why not give the money saved to charity. Or I would encourage taking up a profitable pastime or activity as an alternative, maybe even one of the Bible studies where you can feed body and soul. The middle of Lent is marked by Mothering Sunday which this year is on 10th March, but more about that next month.

TAIZE SERVICE

Come and experience the atmosphere of Taize worship on Sunday 3rd February 6pm at Evenley. The **Taizé Community** is an ecumenical monastic order in Taizé, Saône-et-Loire, Burgundy, France. It is composed of over a hundred brothers, from Protestant and Catholic traditions, who originate from about thirty countries across the world. It was founded in 1940 by Brother Roger Schutz, a Protestant. The community has become one of the world's most important sites of Christian pilgrimage. Over 100,000 young people from around the world make pilgrimages to Taizé each year for prayer, Bible study, sharing, and communal work. Through the community's ecumenical outlook, they are encouraged to live in the spirit of kindness, simplicity and reconciliation. They have developed a unique style of quiet worship and prayer that you can come and experience.

BIODIVERSITY GROUP

Bird Survey – we do hope lots of you have managed to do our Aynho Big Garden Bird Watch around the 26/27 January. Full instructions and the identification sheets were enclosed with the January Newsletter. We will publish the results in the Spring.

As a result of the wet summer there is a real shortage of berries and seeds in the fields and hedgerows so feeding the birds in our gardens is very important this year.

Website – Jill has worked hard and the website is fully up and running now. There is plenty of information, for example on deer, and a children's page with interactive games, colouring etc. Do check it out. **BTO Cuckoo Migration Project** – of the 14 cuckoos tagged this year in the UK only 5 have definitely reached their wintering grounds in Congo. Soon they will start their return Spring migration, another

Bird of the Month

Redwing

The Redwing is the UK's smallest true thrush. It has a creamy strip above the eye and orange-red flank patches. They migrate by night some arriving in September but most in October and November, and then leave again in March or April. If you listen on clear evenings you may hear their "tseep" call as they pass overhead. They feed in the fields and hedgerows on

insects, worms, slugs, snails, fruits and berries and will only visit gardens when it is particularly cold and snow covers the ground. On winter nights they gather in large flocks in woods, thickets, tall conifers and old hedgerows sharing their roost with fieldfares and starlings. They are on the RSPB's 'red' list for birds which is the highest conservation priority, with species needing urgent action.

Did You Know?

- Redwing journey here non-stop from southern Scandinavia often in company with fieldfares and blackbirds.
- They are highly nomadic birds and can spend one winter in the UK but others as far away as Italy, Turkey, Syria, Lebanon, Georgia and even Iran.
- Redwings are among the least robust of thrushes and vulnerable to mass mortality when overcome by cold spells.
