### March Services ~ a word of explanation

Mothering Sunday 10th March

Mothering Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> March falls in the middle of Lent and gets its name from the tradition of those in service being allowed to go home to their mother or home church. For those not in service they would go to the large church in the district or even to the cathedral which is our main mother church. Over the years this tradition has given way



to celebrating our mothers, but the two ideas can be combined by celebrating our mothers in our mother church. At our morning services we welcome everybody to come and celebrate together and posies of flowers will be blessed and given out during the Mothering Sunday Services. I hope to see you there.

Palm Sunday 24th March

On Palm Sunday we remember the day that Jesus entered into Jerusalem riding on a donkey and was greeted by welcoming crowds who waved palm branches like banners in their joy. This year Palm Sunday falls on a Benefice Sunday when all our five village churches meet together to worship. As this is a special Sunday we will be



meeting for 10am at All Saints School, Croughton to start our service with the blessing of the palm crosses and then process to church, re-enacting in a small way Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. At church we will listen to a dramatised telling of his passion, the last week of his life before his death. The end of the communion service will be followed with refreshments.

Holy Week 25th-31st March

Holy Week is the week between Palm Sunday and Easter and is the most holy week of the Christian year. Each day there are special services in each of our five churches as we relive Jesus' final week. This has always been a time when Christians made extra efforts to attend church.

**Compline Services** 

Compline Service is a short service of Night Prayer or Prayers at the End of the Day. It is the final church service of the day in the Christian tradition of canonical hours. The English word *Compline* is derived from the Latin *completorium*, as Compline is the completion of the working day.

Maundy Thursday 28th March

This is the day that Jesus shared his last supper with his disciples and when he was then betrayed and arrested. This year we will remember and re-enact that last meal in an extended Eucharist or Maundy meal. This will take place in Aynho Village Hall from 7pm and combines a simple 3 course meal with a Communion or Eucharist following Jesus' command to do this in remembrance of



him. There will be no charge for the meal, but for catering purposes ask that you sign up on the lists in church.



Good Friday 29<sup>th</sup> March Is the day that Jesus died on the cross. It is only good because his death lead to his resurrection and proof of his power over sin. We celebrate Good Friday at 11am in the morning with two All Age Praise Services at Evenley and Aynho followed by hot cross buns. In the afternoon we have 'an hour at the cross' between 2pm and 3 pm as we remember


the last hour that Jesus suffered before his death. This is a reflective service for

No services this day as it was the Jewish Sabbath and Jesus was dead in the tomb.

#### Easter Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> March

On Easter Day the church is bursting full of life and joy as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection. All our preparations during Lent come to fullness and completion as we welcome our Lord's new life into ours. Our churches are full of flowers and colours and the coming of the Paschal Candle signifies Jesus'



presence with us and his disciples. The empty Easter Egg reminds us of the empty tomb. The Egg full with sweets reminds us of the gift of new life that Jesus brings. Come and join the celebration. Happy Easter



#### **BIODIVERSITY GROUP**

Northamptonshire, traditionally known as 'The Rose of the Shires' has now been described as 'Botanically Luckless'. In a recent report by the wildflower conservation charity 'Plantlife' Northamptonshire comes out as having the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest rate of plant species decline of the 52 counties surveyed. Nearly 1 plant species is being lost every year due to a combination of habitat loss, intensive agriculture, urban expansion and climate change. But all is not yet lost; look at the Wildlife Trust for Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire and Northamptonshire (<a href="http://www.wildlifebcn.org/blog/oliver-burke/2013/01/18/northamptonshire-botanically-luckless-county">http://www.wildlifebcn.org/blog/oliver-burke/2013/01/18/northamptonshire-botanically-luckless-county</a>) to see what is being done to increase land protection.

Bird of the Month The Wren

As one of the smallest of European birds the wren is instantly recognisable with a tiny, round body, brown plumage and short perky tail. Both sexes look alike and juveniles look similar to the adults but with a warmer tone to their plumage. The male bird constructs several globe-shaped nests in holes in walls, banks, trees, or in old nests. When the female has chosen one of the nests, she lines it with feathers and lays smooth, glossy white eggs with reddish spots. She then incubates the eggs alone. The male meanwhile is busy attracting a second and sometimes even a third



female to one of his other nests. This is all very well planned – he feeds the young in the first nest and by the time they are ready to fledge, the eggs in the second nest are hatching and so on. He may be a Casanova but he is also an attentive parent! For such a small bird the Wren has a remarkably loud voice (an irritable 'tek tek' call if you get too close) which can cut through the loudest of background noise. They feed on insects and spiders. The cotoneaster bush is one of their favourite places for food, as there are hundreds of spiders, insects, and larvae to be found there.

#### Did You Know?

- According to legend, the birds held a contest to see who could fly the highest. The magnificent Eagle
  was flying higher than any other bird, but he started to tire. The tiny Wren was hidden in the Eagle's tail
  feathers, and flew out and soared higher than the Eagle, proving that cleverness can triumph over
  strength.
- In winter they survive the cold nights by roosting communally huddling together for warmth. An
  incredible 63 wrens were once found in one nest box!
- They rarely visit bird tables preferring to creep under bushes or along walls so if you are hoping to tempt a wren into your garden it's best to leave food on the ground for them.
- A wren weighs the same as a £1 coin.

#### Bins

#### Rats and vermin

Rats can be tempted by the food we leave out for the birds. It's vital we do this at this time of year but please ensure it is left where it is inaccessible to rats.

Neighbourhood Return

Neighbourhood and Home Watch Network has received funding from the National Lottery to run a scheme in Northamptonshire which aims to help carers and people with dementia who have got lost. We are fore-runners with this project which is being heavily evaluated by the lottery to see if it could be rolled out nationally, so keen not to let the county down, we are determined to try and make it work as effectively as possible, and need your help.

The scheme involves local volunteers with a mobile phone signing up to the Neighbourhood Return. This is how it works.

Carers of people with memory problems, who have gone missing, phone into a central call centre. The call centre sends out a request to all volunteers in the immediate area to see if they are available. If they aren't they just text back no, and if they are, they get sent a photograph and description and directions of where to search. They keep in touch with the call centre to report progress and get further instructions. Volunteers can join or leave a search at any time, they just need to let the call centre know. Maximum time for any search is 2.5 hours after which the police take over.

The piloting has shown that we need 10 people on average to be registered to have four available to search. The idea is therefore to sign up as many people as possible in every area so that some people are always available. It is very important in rural areas across the county as well as in towns, possibly more so because there are less people. We need to ensure carers and people with dementia have support wherever they live.
