Bird of the Month

Swallow Common name: Barn Swallow

Swallows are small birds with dark, glossy-blue backs, red throats, long wings and long tail streamers. They are migratory and flock in large numbers in September ready to fly to Africa, south of the Sahara. In early April, they return to the UK and are often found circling gracefully overhead or skimming low over water drinking and feeding. Both adults build a nest from mud and plant fibres against a beam or shelf in buildings or on cliff ledges. Existing nests are often refurbished, and there



are instances where nests have been reused for nearly 50 years. Both parents catch insects on-the-wing collecting them in their throats to take back to the nest. Large flies are a favourite but aphids are also popular and even wasps. In cold weather feeding the young becomes difficult. At such times the females will spend as much time feeding their brood as they do looking after themselves. The male swallows are more selfish, however, putting more effort into their own needs than that of their young!


Did You Know?

- The long tail feathers give Swallows exceptional manoeuvrability, even better than House Martins and Swifts.
- The males with the longest and most symmetrical tails are the most desired.
- Once fledged the adults feed their young on the wing up to as many as 400 times a day.
- Weather folklore: 'When the swallows fly high, the weather will be dry.' There is some truth in this as on warm sunny days insects are swept up in bubbles of warm air so the swallows have to fly higher to find their food.
