
Rector's letter Welcome to our website

BIODIVERSITY GROUP

Aynho big garden bird watch: summary of results January 2013

A big thank you to the 36 observers who took part in the count. You will all receive a full copy of the results. The results will also be published on our website. If anyone else would like a copy please let us know.

The weekend of 26/27 January was fairly mild compared with the snow and hard frost of the previous week. As a result fewer birds were using the gardens as food became available again in the countryside. In terms of numbers counted **the top 7** were house sparrow, woodpigeon, blackbird, blue tit, chaffinch, collared dove and robin. As robins are so territorial they were seen in a high percentage of gardens, but only as single birds or pairs. On the other hand house sparrows which flock were found in large numbers but seen in fewer gardens. Our large number of house sparrows is encouraging, but the small number of song thrushes is worrying. Bird feeding patterns this winter have been unusual. As summer 2012 was so cool and wet there was a lack of berries, seeds and fruits for birds to eat. Even windfall apples were in short supply. Garden feeding became even more important. Winter thrushes such as fieldfares and redwings were seen in fewer numbers this year as the big flocks moved on to new food sources elsewhere.

A total of **35 species** were identified and for the first time these included buzzard, sparrowhawk, reed bunting. Highest totals, including scarcer species, were generally found round the edge of the village near woods, farmland and water. Large numbers were counted at Aynho Wharf, Aynho Fields, Cartwright Gardens and Portway.
