Biodiversity Group

Reminder - Junior Photo Competition for ages 16 and under. This is being held as part of the Gardening Club Show on 31st August. The theme this year is 'Minibeasts' eg bees, butterflies, caterpillars, ladybirds, snails, beetles etc. Each entrant is allowed one or more photos which should be a maximum size of 7 x 5 and unmounted. Bird of the Month Nuthatch

The nuthatch is a plump bird about the size of a great tit. They have a blue-grey back, chestnut flanks, short tail, black eye stripe, a long pointed bill and large feet with very strong claws for gripping. They are found mostly in southern England and Wales; preferring gardens located close to a suitable breeding habitat, namely deciduous or mixed woodland. They seldom travel far from where they hatched and rarely travel across water. The Nuthatch will either use a hole in a tree or wall, which may be reduced in size by plastering mud around the entrance or take over an abandoned nest. It pairs for life. The female incubates the 6 – 9 eggs while the



male feeds her. Both parents feed the young. They are agile birds running headfirst down trunks as well as upwards, picking insects from the bark therefore helping to control pests that might damage the trees. As well as insects they feed on nuts and seeds, which they jam in crevices in trees and split open with their sharp beaks. They lead a solitary life only occasionally associating with foraging flocks of other small birds. They are strongly territorial, excitable and aggressive. They are rarely quiet using an assortment of whistles, trills and calls. They are becoming more common in gardens now visiting feeders and smearing suet onto a tree trunk can provide an energy rich snack for them. Their lifespan is about 11 years.

Did You Know?

- The most favoured natural site for a nuthatch is the old nest hole of a great spotted woodpecker
- They guard their territory throughout the year which may be because they are protecting their store of food, which is hidden in tree crevices, in the ground, under small stones, or behind bark flakes. They remember these caches for as long as 30 days.
- A pair of nuthatches requires a minimum of about one hectare of good quality habitat in order to successfully raise a family.
- The name nuthatch derives from the Middle English word 'nuthak', which roughly translates as 'nut hacker'.
