BIODIVERSITY GROUP

December has seen the arrival of our winter visitors – fieldfare, redwing, siskin and brambling may well be spotted in your garden, and if you are fortunate, a waxwing may provide a striking addition, particularly if you have planted rowan or hawthorns. It is essential that bird feeders and tables are meticulously cleaned at this time of the year. You may use a mild disinfectant, but always wear gloves and do not bring the feeders indoors. Needless to say, wash your hands thoroughly when you have finished cleaning.

However, do not forget that water is just as essential as food for birds, therefore make sure that bird baths have clean water on a regular basis, and if it looks like a sharp frost, place a ball in the water then remove it in the morning to reveal the unfrozen water.

This is also a time when shrubs can be pruned and cut back, but remember to leave some fruit on trees, such as the occasional apple, as these will provide valuable food for our birds.

Bird of the Month

The Brambling

The brambling is a finch whose plumage changes considerably between summer and winter. In the winter (which is when you may be lucky enough to see one) the male and female look very similar. They have a black head, orange breast, white rump with mainly black upper parts mingled with orange and at first glance can be mistaken for a chaffinch. They arrive from Scandinavia to as far afield as West-




ern Siberia from mid-September and stay until March or April. They eat mostly seeds and berries (beech mast is a particular favourite) moving further south when their food source is exhausted or making use of feeding stations in gardens. They breed between April and June. The female builds a deep cup shaped nest and lays between 5-7 eggs, which she incubates for 11-12 days. Both parents then feed the chicks on a diet of insects until they fledge 13 or 14 days later. The maximum recorded life span is 8 years and 7 months but it is thought they can live to over 14 years.

Did You Know?

- · They are the most highly migratory of all the finches.
- In winter this bird forms vast flocks wherever its food is particularly abundant.
- The largest recorded gathering of any bird in the world was when over 70 million bramblings roosted in Tun, Switzerland in 1951.

The brambling has also been called the Cock O' the North and the Mountain Finch.
