Letter from the Rector

The Church of England is a funny thing in many ways, it loves using strange words for ordinary things, pews instead of seats, stalls instead of chairs. It also has a very ancient structure of governance and office, this leads to people being called rectors and vicars or parish priests, and it is governed by Parochial Church Councils and Synods. On June 29th, which is the festival of St. Peter and Paul, also known as Petertide, Shemil Mathew and others will be ordained Deacon in Peterborough Cathedral. Shemil will then come and join our Benefice, the collective name for our five parishes (or villages) as our Assistant Curate.

So what is a Deacon and what do they do, many people have asked.

At a Deacon's Ordination the Bishop says;

'Deacons are ordained so that the people of God may be better equipped to make Christ known. Theirs is a life of visible self-giving. Christ is the pattern of their calling and their commission; as he washed the feet of his disciples, so they must wash the feet of others.'

The office of a Deacon is in simple terms one of a servant, to serve the people to whom they minister. Once you are ordained into Holy Orders, you first become a Deacon for life, a servant, just as Jesus was a servant to his disciples.

Later on a Deacon may be ordained a Priest or even a Bishop, but when that happens you don't stop being a deacon or a servant to the parish. Shemil's job title will be that of 'Curate', (as mine is Rector). his qualification to do the job of being a curate is to first be ordained Deacon. Next year we would expect him to be Ordained a Priest, but he will still have the job or position of being the curate.

BIODIVERSITY GROUP

Flaming June is upon us and we are all enjoying the buzz of the bees working hard, pollinating our flowers. However, I can hear rather more bees than usual, as I have a nest of bees in my loft! One of our members identified the bee as a tree bumble bee, a beautiful bee, coloured black, orange and white. Apparently, if left alone, they will eventually leave my loft. They will not fly in the dark, so will not fly around in the roof space. They will not damage wood (unlike wasps). However, the most interesting fact I found was that they have only lived in this country since 2001. Remarkable! They are now common across the south of England.

Sports Field update: in spite of the best efforts of the late April overnight frost, I am pleased to report that the meadow grass, planted on top of the large mound alongside the running track has now made an appearance. At the time of writing, I think that the wildflowers on the front slope of the mound have just started to poke through the soil. Or they might be more weeds! Please take a wander over and check out for yourselves how the mound is looking in this glorious month.

Bird of the Month The Blackcap

The Blackcap is a warbler with a distinctive black (in the male) or red-brown (in the female) cap, and is a little smaller than the sparrow. Its delightful fluting song has earned it the name of 'northern nightingale' or 'lesser nightingale'. They are primarily a summer migrant, flying here from Iberia and North Africa, in April and May and leaving again in September and October. The warmer winters, abundance of berries and garden feeders, however, has seen a rise in some of the



birds that breed in Germany migrating here to overwinter. Adults return to previous breeding sites with the male quickly establishing a territory which he defends against garden warblers and other Blackcaps. The female builds a neat cup shape nest from vegetation and mud usually in a hedge, bush or brambles, though they will also use shelves in huts and other outbuildings. She lays between 4 – 6 eggs which both birds incubate. During the breeding season Blackcaps usually feed on insects, such as aphids, caterpillars, flies and spiders as well as swallowing small snails whole; the calcium helps in the production of their eggs. In July the diet switches increasingly to fruit as the fruit sugar helps the birds to fatten up for migration. They still eat aphids however, as they often contain sugars from the plant sap they feed on. Blackcaps are illegally trapped in large numbers in Mediterranean countries, particularly Malta and Cyprus, where they are considered a delicacy but despite this their numbers seem to be holding as they spread their territories northwards.

Did You Know?

- The Blackcaps song is virtually identical to their close relative the garden warbler; close enough, in fact, that they even confuse each other.
- Blackcaps have a reputation for being bolshie at garden feeders, seeing off other birds that dare to come to feed. Even robins which tend to be top dogs amongst the smaller garden birds can be put in their place.
- Blackcaps are one of the few birds that like mistletoe berries. They take one berry at a time and wipe the seeds off their beaks on branches making them effective seed spreaders.
- The switch in migratory behaviour appears to be creating a distinct population. The British/German birds arrive back in Germany earlier than the Spanish ones. They therefore pair up and breed together so much so that they now have slightly different genes and some structural differences such as slightly shorter, more rounded wings which are better for maneuverability but not so good for long distance flying evolution in action!

From your PARISH COUNCIL

Green Lane

Cllr James met with a representative of MGWSP last month to discuss the Green Lane closure.

The reason for the closure is not the part of the Byway Open to All Traffic (BOAT) at the Aynho end, but down at the Kings Sutton end. It is very badly disrupted and should have been repaired last summer, but wasn't. It is closed for H & S reasons, so that NCC is not liable for injuries etc. Enforcement is up to the Police. Horse owners would get 'advice' but vehicle drivers or riders would get a traffic ticket. All vehicles using the BOAT must be taxed & insured & driven by a licensed driver, just as on a normal road.

They can only close the byway in between the gates, so the whole of the BOAT is shut, even though the bit in Aynho Parish is OK. The work will be started in the next few weeks, and the closure will be extended to cover that work. The minimum time for closure is 6 months, though they could lift the closure if the work was finished and the ground had recovered. They would prefer to leave it closed all summer, and then during the next gate locking period (October to March) so the surface could recover well.
