



Rector's Letter

It is amazing that a year ago there was a new face on the block, we welcomed the Reverend Shemil Mathew as our new assistant curate to our five villages. Over the past year his new face has become a recognised face to many people as he has worked all over the place. From a familiar smile at coffee mornings to the organiser of Messy Church at Farthinghoe and Hinton. Now we are looking forward to the next stage in his journey when on 27th June he will be ordained a priest by the Bishop of Peterborough at Peterborough Cathedral. His ordination to priest is on top of his ordination to deacon, just as mine and all priests are. As a priest he will be given authority to conduct weddings, preside at communions and declare God's forgiveness and blessing. A whole coach load of parishioners will be going to Peterborough Cathedral to support him there. For those who go and those who cannot make the journey, Shemil will preside at his first communion on Sunday 28th June at 11am (a slightly later time than normal) at St. Michael Aynho, and this Benefice service will be followed by a lunch in Aynho Village Hall. June is also a time of change for the church, At the end of May we celebrated the Coming of the Holy Spirit and the change that brought to the early church. Now in June we enter into the season of Trinity, when we celebrate that great mystery of God in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And yet still hold true to the first of the Ten Commandments that there is only one God.

St. Patrick is said to have explained this as the three leaves of the shamrock, yet it being one plant.

Others have said it is like a person who is a father to their children, a husband to their wife and son to their parents; father, husband, son, three people but in one person. As Christians we see God as the creator of the world, Jesus as the saviour of the world and the Holy Spirit as God's working in the world today.

To me complete understanding of the mystery is not important, for I believe it is beyond us. But the words often heard at a wedding from St. Paul's letter to the church in Corinth sum it up very well.

Now these three remain, faith, hope and love and the greatest of these is love. I invite you to come and join in our worship to the God of Love, shown in Jesus and alive and well in the world today.

Gigaclear Installation – Progress Update

The installation of the Gigaclear Ultrafast Broadband network started as planned on 20 April and has now be in progress for 5 weeks. It is expected that it will take another 3 weeks to complete the installation. The construction (digging the trenches and laying fibre optic cable) of the network is being carried out by Prior Construction – led by Glen Prior. Some residents will have already met him – but as the works approach your household please do make contact with him if you have any concerns. Whilst there will inevitably by some disruption he is keen to minimise it. The actual connection of the 'pots' to the junction points and the Cabinet on junction Portway/Charlton Road is being carried out by Boxcom. There were some issues at the start of the works – lack of cables – which was not Prior Construction's fault – which delayed the works on Charlton Road and The Butts. This has now been resolved. Likewise there were some issues over lack of written notice being given to households but this should also have been resolved now. The location of the 'pots' outside houses will be marked with red ink. Finally some works will be carried out at weekends. Prior Construction has already started the reinstatement works. As the project continues there will be a 'snagging' list and so if you have any concerns about reinstatement in your road could you email Sadie with a description and if possible photo.

Gigaclear cont/. Some residents are keen to get a service as soon as possible – so when will you be able to get a live connection? Gigaclear will notify those residents who have signed up for the service the procedure for installation – but at this stage it expected actual live connections will be start to me made until late July If you have not signed up you can do so at www.gigaclear.com. There will also be a demonstration of the service in the Village Hall once the connection is live.

Finally the Parish Council would like to thank all residents for their patience during the construction of the network which can be disruptive for a couple of days and it is appreciated that not all residents have signed up at this stage for Gigaclear. It is also encouraging that we have received a number of positive comments concerning the quality and speed of works being undertaken by Glen and his team.

BIODIVERSITY GROUP

Bird of the Month: The Pied Wagtail

The pied wagtail is a small, long tailed black and white bird which can be seen dashing about over lawns or car parks in search of food. During the winter, at dusk, they flock together at warm roost sites like reed beds and sewage works or trees and bushes in city centres. Warm places are hard to find so they are happy to share especially as there is the added bonus of safety in numbers. These roost sites also act as an information exchange. Birds having difficulty finding food simply follow the ones that are in better condition in the morning! They nest from April onwards and the males are very territorial at this time even



attacking their own reflections in wing mirrors and hubcaps of parked cars. The female alone builds the small cup shaped nest out of grass and mosses in ivy, holes in walls, under roofs or even in old nests of larger birds. She then lays 3-7 pale grey eggs and incubates them. After about 14 days the eggs hatch and both birds feed the young who fledge after 13-16 days. At this stage the juveniles are brownish-grey and often tinged with yellow. Wagtails eat insects but will feed on seeds and even rubbish in the winter. When catching prey in flight they zig-zag, tumble and circle using their tails as a rudder. No one is quite sure why they constantly wag their tails but amongst the suggestions are; a way of signalling to others, to flush out insects or as camouflage when hunting next to flowing water and riverside vegetation. Pied wagtails along with their cousins the white wagtail are the most widespread breeding birds in Europe, breeding everywhere from Iceland and arctic Norway south to Andalucía and Sicily. Such widespread breeding is an indication of this wagtail's adaptability, for it is just as happy in high mountain valleys as city centres. Pied wagtails are on the green list of birds not endangered.

Did You Know?

- Other names for the pied wagtail include Polly washdish, dishwasher, Penny wagtail, water wagtail.
- The biggest wagtail roosts may have as many as 4,000 birds.
- Buckingham Palace supports a wagtail roost.
- On average during the winter daylight hours they eat a small item of prey every 3 4 seconds
- Though the pied wagtails in southern Britain are largely sedentary, northern populations migrate considerable distances

Aynho Conservation Area What does it mean? Is your home in the Conservation Area?


South Northants have recently reviewed the Aynho Conservation area.

After initial public consultation South Northamptonshire Council has now reviewed and revised the proposed boundary for Aynho Conservation Area. There are no major changes from the original and current conservation area boundary. The only proposed change is minor plot rationalisation at College Fields. The properties at The Glebe and College Fields will be reinstated after their initial proposed removal.

How Being in a Conservation Area Can Affect You

Although conservation areas mean some extra planning controls and considerations, these exist to protect the historic and architectural elements which make the place special.

They are most likely to affect owners who want to work on the outside of their building or any trees on their property.



Your House

Being in a conservation area whether your house also has a Grade I, II or II*listing might mean that your house is affected by special controls which restrict work you can normally do without planning permission such as building an extension, replacing a door or window or altering gutters and downpipes. These controls are put in place by SNC to protect particular elements of local buildings

Trees

If you want to cut down, top or lop any but the smallest of trees in a conservation area you must notify South-Northants planning authority six weeks before work begins. The authority will then consider the contribution the tree makes to the character of the area and if necessary create a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) to protect it.

Demolition

If you live in a conservation area and want to demolish all or part of your building, you will need Planning Permission. If the building is listed you will also need Listed Building Consent.

Who Do I Ask About Changes?

SNC will tell you what you can do to your home if you live in a conservation area. They will be able to say whether special controls are in place and explain what you may and may not need permission for.

There is a Conservation Area Appraisals for the Aynho conservation area. It outlines the history of the area and explains what makes it special. It also provides some general guidelines on managing and carrying out development in the conservation area.

What is an Article 4(2) direction?

An Article 4(2) direction restricts development of properties without applying for the appropriate permission. Houses in the Village covered by an article 4(2) direction are shown in purple on the map. For complete and up to date information refer to advice from South Northants Planning department but in

essence permission may be required for a house with an Article 4(2) directive for work such as any extensions, changes to the roof or chimneys and painting the exterior, changing boundaries, adding a porch or satellite dish.
