



From your Rector

Happy Christmas to all our readers, I pray that you may all have a joyful and Christ filled Christmas. Not forgetting that it is Christ-mas, thank fully we haven't yet got to the stage of wishing people a happy festival, for Christmas is about Christ and the coming of the Christ Child. A child whose parents knew all about the problems of invading forces taking over their country. Of massacres on a ruler's whim and the fright of having to flee home and family and seek refuge in a foreign country. Most of this sounds sadly all too familiar today.

Christmas is a time for giving, it started with the giving of the gift of the Christ child, Jesus. Bringing joy not only to his parents, but also a joy for the whole world. Tour de Trigs Challenge – 5th & 6th December

Ian Calderbank from 15 The Butts, Aynho will be attempting the above challenge with Andrew Fairbairn & David Stevens to raise funds for the charity **"Shelter".** It involves a 50 miles in 24 hours (approx.15 hours in darkness) hiking/orienteering exercise known as the Tour de Trigs (<u>www.tourdetrigs.org.uk</u>) challenge on 5/6 December 2015. They are aiming for the full 50 miles. However, since its inception in the mid 1960s, less than 30% of past participants have achieved this. There are however a "Taster" Section of 15 miles and a "Taster" section of 30 miles for which certificates have been awarded. The test is not just one of endurance but also to navigate from grid reference numbers (using maps and compass, no GPS). BIODIVERSITY GROUP Plant of the Month – The Poinsettia

The poinsettia belongs to the Euphorbia family and is, in fact, a small shrub or tree which was once thought of as a weed. It is a native of Southern Mexico where it can grow to 10 - 15 feet in height and has leaves that are 6 to 8 inches across. The red leaves are not flowers but bracts and are produced to attract insects to the tiny flowers around which they grow.



From the 14th to the 16th centuries the Aztecs used the sap to help control fevers and the leaves to make a reddish/purple fabric dye for clothing. Joel Roberts Poinsett, botanist, physician and the first United States Ambassador to Mexico discovered the plant in 1828 sending cuttings back to his plantation in South Carolina and Poinsettia Day is still celebrated in the USA to mark the anniversary of his death. There are many names for the poinsettia and legends. The Aztecs called the poinsettia 'Love Stars' because they thought the bracts were coloured by drops of blood from an Aztec goddess who died of a broken heart. In Mexico and Guatemala, legend says that a poor girl called Pepita had no gift for the baby Jesus at the Christmas Eve service so picked some weeds growing at the side of the road. She put them by the nativity scene in the Chapel and immediately they turned into bright red flowers. This was thought of as a miracle and the flowers became known as the 'Flowers of the Holy Night'. Other names include the lobster flower, flame-leaf flower and in Spain the Easter Flower.


Did You Know?

- The poinsettia didn't arrive in the UK until the late 1800s.
- Although it is not poisonous if eaten, it can cause mild nausea or vomiting not only in humans but in pets as well.
- People with a latex allergy may suffer an allergic reaction to the sap.

• There are over a 100 varieties of poinsettias now, but red is still the most popular.
