From The Rectory:

A Christmas Reflection (from Advent wonder)

Job description for an angel. To be a messenger, care giver, guardian and onlooker. The angel Gabriel is best known for bearing the good news of Jesus' birth, but before he spoke with Mary, he went to Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist, (Luke: 1:19). Here he describes himself with the Greek word 'paristano' which means 'stands.' Gabriel stands in the presence of God waiting to serve. He is God's servant messenger.

But on the night of Jesus' birth, the angels have a night off from their usual duties. Why?

Because this night is different: it is a night of joy and celebration; a night when the angels look deeply into the beauty and good news of a promised salvation. The scripture tells us that the field shone with the glory of God when the first angel appeared. This angel of the Lord speaks of 'good news of great joy' of a Saviour's birth and then:

"Suddenly, the angel was joined by a vast host of others—the armies of heaven—praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in highest heaven, and peace on earth to those with whom God is pleased." Luke 2: 13-14 (NLT)

This vast host of angels are not the source of the light; they reflect His light. This is their honour: to be a mirror for God's glory. Paul, in his first letter to Timothy (6:16), describes this light as 'unapproachable'.

But on this night, the angels help make the unapproachable approachable and they share this shimmering, dazzling, blinding light with shepherds, and, by song and story, with us.

They can't help themselves. They could not stop if they wanted to. This joyful news is no longer private, once spoken to individuals: Mary and Joseph; Elizabeth and Zacharias, even from God to Gabriel. This message of 'great joy' is now publicly sung in a field to a group of shepherds by a vast army of angels. All are bathed in the Lord's overflowing light and glory which overpowers the darkness. It is boundless; endless; without limits.

Drenched in the light and carried by the song, the shepherds leave their sheep to run and see this promised Saviour in swaddling clothes and they encounter the Light of the World:

"I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8:12

Overflowing with joy, they too can't help themselves — telling everyone they meet of Jesus' birth. Like the angels, the shepherds reflect His light to a world in darkness. The light is the message; the message is our gift.

In His season; reflect on Him; reflect His light and 'Shine like Stars'.

BIODIVERSITY GROUP

Tree of the Month - The Conifer



Conifers are a group of trees that produce seeds inside cones and ever-

green

needle-like leaves. The earliest conifers in the fossil record date from about 300 million years ago. The modern conifer order contains eight families and over 600 species, including pines, cypress, firs and yew. The Scots pine, the yew and the common juniper are the only ones native to Britain having colonised it after the last ice age.

Did You Know?

- Pine cones were the favourite food of the Parasaurolophus, one of the duck-billed dinosaurs that lived 60 million years ago. Their uniquely formed jaw and hundreds of teeth were perfectly adapted to eat the tough, chewy cones.
- Scots pines were planted to mark droveways helping travellers find their way. They were also planted around farmsteads to act as windbreaks.
- The Druids decorated pine trees in the wild with images of things they wished the waning year to bring – fruits for a successful harvest, love charms for happiness, nuts for fertility and coins for wealth.
- Children in Finland and Sweden make traditional toys called 'Cone Cows' using pine cones with sticks for legs. In Finland there is a park with giant pine cone cow sculptures large enough for children to ride on.
- The Egyptian staff of Osiris dating back 1224BC has a pine cone on it as does the Pope's sacred staff.
- Many yews in Britain are known to be over 1000 years old.
- The yew often starts growing again when it is about 500 years old.

Sports Field and Pavilion

Aynho PC is looking for a volunteer to take over the caretaking of the pavilion. Duties will include organising general maintenance of the Pavilion. A comprehensive list will be provided to anyone interested.

Without a new volunteer there is a chance the Pavilion will cease to be usable which would be a great shame for the village.

Are you and your dog acting lawfully?

Did you know that since April 2016 it has been a legal requirement to have your dog microchipped?

It is also an offence to allow your dog to be dangerously out of control in a public place. Dangerously out of control mean if your dog makes someone worried it might injure them so although you might not think your pet is dangerously out of control, it could be interpreted as being.

Not picking up after your dog has fouled is also an offence and you could be charged up to £1000.

Although by far and away the majority of dog owners in our village are considerate APC wanted to remind everyone of these facts. We would also request that all dogs are kept on leads whilst being walked on the Black Path (the path alongside the Children's Play area). This is a problem area for fouling and it has been noted and reported that dogs are off lead, running ahead of owners and fouling, possibly without the owner's knowledge. There have also been reports of dogs running out on to the road.

Due to the correspondent being on holiday the autumn newsletter was missed sincere apologies to Robert. His contribution started the 15th year of the birth of The Aynho Recorded Music Society with a refreshing programme beginning with Grieg's "Piano Concerto" 1st

Movement. This was followed in stark contrast by Scott Joplin "The Entertainer" and Henry Litolff's dazzling "Scherzo". The evening continued with items from "High Society" and after the convivial break by Bruch's "Violin Concerto". There followed Val Doonican's "Walk Tall" "King of the Road" and "What would I be". Grieg's 3rd Movement of "Piano Concerto" brought a most interesting programme to a close. Many thanks Robert.

The November contribution was presented by Ian. It was a dazzling mixture and a very full programme which started with the "Baroque" period, including Monteverdi, Purcell, Tallis and Gluck. We then moved swiftly into the "Classical Era" Schubert, Mendelssohn and Rossini. "The Romantic" period was represented by Tchaikovsky, Frank and Rubenstein. The solemnity was then shattered by George Formby singing "Aunty Maggie's Remedy" which was taken advantage of at the interval.
