

Admission: Exhibitors Free. Others: Adults 50p, Children Free.

#### RULES OF THE SHOW.

- All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor, unless otherwise stated in the rules.
   Exhibitors need not be members of The Aynho Gardening Club, but if not, must be resident in Aynho.
- 2. The entrance fee for each exhibit shall be 20p, payable when the entry form is handed in.
- 3. Only one entry will be allowed in each class for each person.
- 4. Entries must be staged between 9.30 a.m. and 11.15 a.m. on Saturday.

# This rule will be strictly enforced.

- 5. Prize money will be First = 50p, Second = 30p, Third = 20p in each class.
- 6. Prize money will be paid between 3.00 p.m. and 4.00 p.m. on the day of the show.
- 7. Exhibitors must bring their own staging material, i.e. vases, plates, etc. For the purpose of this show a vase will be a container which is higher than it is wide.
- 8. No exhibits are to be removed from the tables while the show is open, except if requested to do so by the show manager or a member of the committee.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 10. Judging will be by independent Judges and will take place from 11.15 a.m. The Judge's decision is final.
- 11. All details & measurements in the schedules must be adhered to.
- Any objections must be made to the Show Secretary, Mrs. Carol McClellan, either directly
  - or via another committee member.
- 13. Non-competitive exhibits will be welcome, subject to display room. Please inform Mrs Carol McClellan before the day of the show.

#### CLASSES.

#### **Flowers**

One vase of hardy perennial border flowers

One vase or bowl of annuals

One bowl of cut herbs, decorative and/or culinary

One vase or bowl of any garden flower and/or foliage, may include bulbs, shrubs, etc.

One specimen flower, not a rose, sweet pea dahlia or gladioli

### Roses

One specimen bloom, any variety

One specimen bloom, judged for perfume

One stem cluster flower bush (floribunda)

One stem of miniature roses

#### **Dahlias**

- 10. One specimen bloom
- 11. Vase of four dahlias, mixed, any variety
- 12. Vase of three dahlias, decorative
- 13. Vase of three dahlias, cactus
- 14. Vase of three dahlias, pom-pom (under 2 ins)
- 15. Vase of three dahlias ball (over 2 ins)

#### Gladioli

- 16. One specimen spike
- 17. Three gladioli of one variety
- 18. Four gladioli of mixed varieties

# Chrysanthemums

19. Vase of three sprays

# Sweet Peas

- 20. Bowl of annual sweet peas
- 21. Bowl of perennial sweet peas

#### **Pansies**

22. Four pansies staged on a box

# **Fuchsias**

23. Three sprays of mixed or same fuchsia

# Pot Plants.

- 24. One plant, flowering
- 25. One plant, foliage

#### Vegetables

- 26. 5 tomatoes, with calyx
- 27. 6 Gardeners Delight tomatoes or similar, with calyx
- 28. 5 white potatoes
- 29. 5 coloured potatoes
- 30. 2 table marrows
- 31. 5 runner beans, with stalks
- 32. 5 French beans, with stalks
- 33. The longest runner bean
- 34. 3 courgettes, with or without stalk & flower (max 6ins excluding stalk & flower)
- 35. 3 beetroot, with 2ins of leaf stem
- 36. 6 shallots
- 37. 3 white onions from seed
- 38. 3 white onions from sets
- 39. 3 red onions from sets
- 40. 3 carrots, with 2ins of leaf stem
- 41. 1 cucumber, greenhouse/frame
- 42. 1 cucumber, grown outside
- 43. 2 lettuces
- 44. 2 sweetcorn with outer leaves still intact
- 45. Three vegetables chosen from the following six: 3 potatoes / 2 tomatoes / 4 shallots
  - 4 runner beans / 3 carrots with 2ins of leaf stem
  - 3 beetroot with 2ins of leaf stem.
  - Vegetables to be shown in a tray not exceeding 18ins by 12ins overall -only parsley may be used as a dressing
- 46. Two of one type of vegetable not covered in any of the above classes
- 47. A trug of any mixed vegetables and herbs
- 48. The longest marrow
- 49. The funniest shaped vegetable

# Fruit

- (All hard or stoned fruit must have stalks attached.)
- 50. Plate of 6 plums
- 51. Plate of 3 dessert apples
- 52. Plate of 3 cooking apples
- 53. Plate of 24 blackberries, with calyx attached
- 54. Plate of soft fruit (not blackberries)
- 55. Plate of 6 apricots (no stalks)
- 56. Plate of 3 pears

## Floral Art (See Floral Art Rules Below)

- 57. An arrangement of flowers in a small wineglass (max 6ins wide by 6ins deep)
- 58. An arrangement in a Welly Boot (any foliage or support may be used) (max. 16ins wide by 12ins deep) (NB. 57 and 58 have no restriction on height)

#### Floral Art Rules for nos. 57 & 58 above

- a. Natural plant material must predominate in both classes.
- b. Flowers and foliage do not necessarily have to have been grown by the exhibitor.
- c. A back-cloth may be used.

#### Homecraft

- 59. Six savoury biscuits your choice-all the same
- 60 6 pieces of Butternut Squash Cake made according to the attached recipe
- 61. An open fruit flan-pastry base
- 62. One jar of chutney (dated at least 3 months old)
- 63. One jar of pickles (dated at least 3 months old)
- 64. One jar of apricot jam
- 65. One jar of jam, other than apricot
- 66. One jar of marmalade
- 67. A loaf of bread- any kind not made in a breadmaking machine or from a packet mix.

#### Family Class (Children & Parents)

68. Make a vehicle out of recycled materials.

## Special Exhibits (Children may enter any of the classes)

- 69. A colour photograph 'Berries'. (max 7 ins by 5 ins unmounted)
- 70. A colour photograph 'Garden Wildlife'. (max 7 ins by 5 ins unmounted)
- 71. A hand-knitted garment (item not exhibited previously)
- 72. An article of needlework/embroidery (item not exhibited previously)
- 73. A small article made from wood (item not exhibited previously)
- A craft item not covered in any of the above classes (item not exhibited previously)

<u>The Aynho Gardening Club Shield</u> donated by Ron Sawbridge, will be awarded to the Exhibitor who wins the highest number of First Prizes.

<u>The George Ashbrook Trophy</u> will be awarded for the best flower in the show (pot grown or cut).

<u>The Best Vegetable Cup</u> donated by Mr. T Godfrey, will be awarded for the best vegetable in the show.

<u>The Homecraft Plate</u> will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of prizes in the Floral Art and Homecraft categories.(Classes 57-67)

The above awards will be held for one year and cannot be held outright.

# The Royal Horticultural Society's Banksian Medal

This special medal from The Royal Horticultural Society is to be awarded to the person with the largest amount of prize money in the whole of the horticultural classes at the show, classes 1 to 56. Competitors who have won the medal in the previous two years are not eligible to win the medal this year.
