I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to all who helped at the harvest celebrations with gifts of money and harvest produce and decorating the churches. Although we make a great effort at this time of year, the people we help need all year round support. October kicks off our autumn bible study groups which will meet weekly until Advent (December). We will meet in the five villages at various times and locations. We will all have heard the phrase, if music be the food of love.. play on, it reminds us of the important place that music plays in our worship. Over the years the instruments and songs may have changed but music has always been important. I would like to thank all who play or sing to help enhance our worship in all our churches. Maybe you would like to join the robed choir at Aynho, or if you would like a different commitment why not join the group of singers known as the BFC (full title Benefice Festival Chorus). The BFC meet on a Thursday evening from 7:30pm to 9pm either in one of the churches or Aynho village hall when it gets cold. And then they sing at one or two services each term.
