Palm Sunday 25th March

Palm Sunday marks the start of Holy Week. This year we start our Palm Sunday procession at 10am from All Saints School in Croughton, with the blessing of our Palm crosses. We will then process the short distance to All Saints Church, the service will start when the procession arrives. At church, in the context of a Communion Service, we hear again the telling of our Lord Jesus Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, remember his last supper and passion, before spending the next 7 days of Holy Week in our final preparations for Easter.

Compline Services

The Compline Service is a short service of Night Prayer or Prayers at the End of the Day. It's the final short, said church service of the day. The English word *Compline* is derived from the Latin *completorium*, as Compline is the completion of the working day. (see Service Sheet)

Maundy Thursday 29th Maundy meal at Aynho Village Hall

This is the day that Jesus shared his last supper with his disciples and when he was then betrayed and arrested. This year we will remember and re-enact that last meal in an extended Eucharist or Maundy meal. This combines a simple 3 course meal with a Communion or Eucharist following Jesus' command to "do this in remembrance of him". Good Friday 30th

The day on which Jesus was crucified, not for anything he had done, but for all the wrong we have done. He was innocent and yet paid the price for human sin. It is 'good' because through his death Jesus removed the barrier that separates us from having the right relationship with God. His death is remembered in the Cross of Hot Cross Buns and in our services at church.

Services suitable for all ages will be held in the morning and a more reflective service "An Hour at the Cross" will be held at 2pm at Hinton-in-the-Hedges on Good Friday afternoon.

Church Membership & Electoral Roll

The Church of England is a legal body covered by The Church representation rules. This means that the church has a membership list that allows the members to vote on political and religious matter within the church structure.

Official membership has no cost but the applicant must be:-

1. baptised 2. over 16 years of age and 3. must be one of the following: (a) resident in the parish; (b) habitually attend the parish church for at least 6 months; (c) be a member of a church in good standing with the C of E.

To me the Churches Electoral Roll is much more than a list of names, it is also for me a means of communicating with the whole church body in any village. I would ask that if you come to church and can fulfil the above requirements that you please complete an application form that can be found in church or from your local representative shown below. If you cannot fulfil the above requirements it doesn't mean you are not welcome, for all are welcome. It just means it would be good to have a chat with me to see what we can do.


AYNHO W.I. – Wednesday 21st March 7.30pm in the Village Hall

A word from your Parish Council about Farm Liaison

Following several recent conversations with villagers about the fencing off of fields down Green Lane and the noise from bird-scarers, we have made contact with the farm manager for all the fields farmed north of the village boundary down Green Lane. The farm manager of Astrop Farms and Councillor Anderson had a long and constructive conversation. They are frustrated with the public walking on fields that do not have official footpaths. The grass margins are environmental features to provide habitats for wild life but are not effective if constantly walked. This is the reason that the entrances have been fenced off. Staff have been abused when spraying fields (they must stop when seeing a member of the public) and they have had bird scarers vandalised causing several hundred pounds of damage. You can see the relationship between the farm community and public has deteriorated though there had not been any problems with Aynho residents specifically.

Councillor Anderson pointed out that some official footpaths were either not signposted or not instated due to ploughing or crops growing. In the case of the latter, walkers are permitted to walk around the field margins.

In order to help the farming community, it would be appreciated if residents can help by:

Keeping to official footpaths where possible.

Alerting Aynho Parish Council via the Clerk to any suspicious or anti-social, damaging behaviour seen on farm land so we can inform the farmers. This would include trail bikers, cars driving on BOATS (byway open to all traffic) and horses not being on official bridleways.

If you are walking and see a farmer spraying the crops please try and remove yourself from the vicinity as soon as practical so they don't have to stop their work.

If you do encounter a farm worker, please do not antagonise them while they are trying to work. Please be supportive and declare yourself an Aynho resident who is supportive and hopefully our campaign will be a model for other villages in the surrounding area.

The issue of bird scarers was also discussed and there are several placed in the fields to deter pigeons from eating the newly sprouting rape. These are placed well away from official footpaths although their noise is still significant and does scare some dogs. They are set to go off every 60 minutes from dawn to dusk. If you feel their noise is becoming intrusive then let APC know and we can make representations to have them re-directed.

Having opened a line of communication, we will now work to improve understanding and co-operation with local farmers. APC had, for many years, a farm representative on the Council and organised summer farm walks where villagers could meet farmers and discuss their work. It is our aim to continue to work with the farming community to re-build lines of communication and mutual understanding and in 2019 re-instate a farm walk.

BIODIVERSITY GROUP: Insect of the Month The Brimstone Butterfly

Brimstone butterflies are a medium-large butterfly with leaf shaped wings. The males are lemon-yellow whilst the females are a very pale green. Both have a small orange spot on each wing. In April or May they lay their eggs on buckthorn or alder buckthorn shrubs. They are laid on their own which is unusual as most butterflies lay their eggs in clusters. The caterpillars emerge two weeks later and



spend most of the next four weeks eating and shedding their skin - four times in all. To pupate they move away from their food source forming their chrysalis, which looks like a curled leaf, on a nearby plant. It takes about two weeks for the caterpillars to transform into butterflies so that the adults emerge in late July or early August. They all then go on a feeding frenzy building up their fat reserves ready for winter. By late September they have disappeared, hibernating amongst ivy, bramble or holly leaves. The following March they begin to emerge on warm, sunny days and it is now that the males start looking for a female to mate with. They have the longest adult lifespan of any UK butterfly, nine to ten months, so even though they only have one brood annually they can be seen for most of the year. They are widespread across most of the UK and can be found in almost any habitat from woods and chalk downlands to gardens.

Did You Know?

- Brimstone butterflies have a very long proboscis enabling them to take nectar from plants such as teasels and runner bean flowers which are beyond the reach of other butterflies.
- The green caterpillars can adjust their colour to match the leaves they are feeding on.
- They are strong flyers and especially in the spring may travel some distance in search of a mate.
- They are the first butterflies to appear after the winter.
- In spring they feed on the nectar from dandelions, primroses, cowslips, bugle and bluebells.
