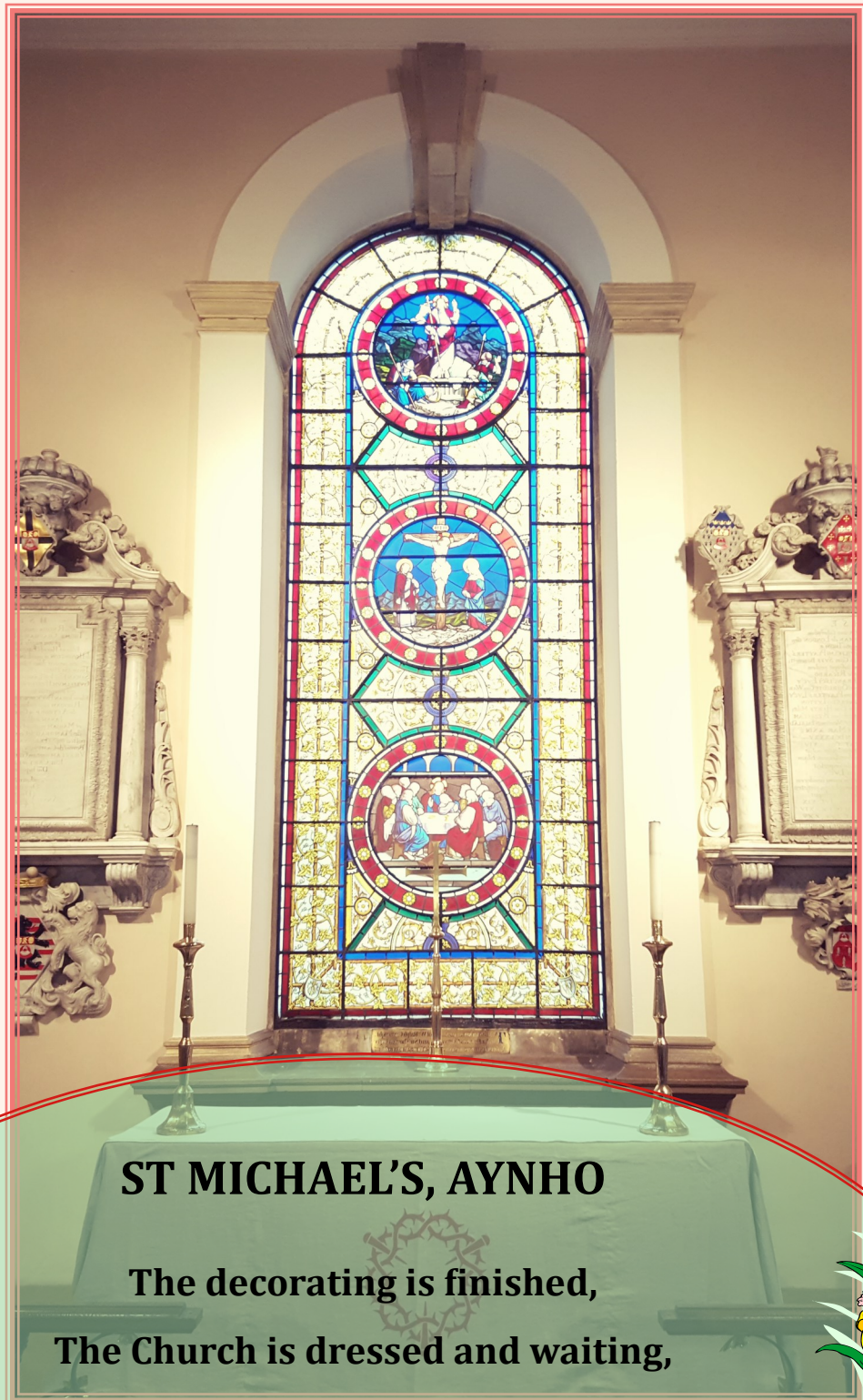

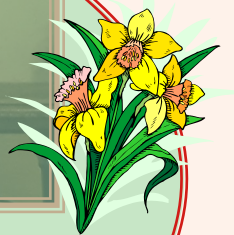

Community Matters – Cold Callers and Nottingham Knockers

There have been recent incidents in Aynho where doorstep callers are using well known villagers' names as a recommendation – do not be misled! They offer small household products for sale. Sometimes called 'Nottingham Knockers' these callers may claim to be ex-convicts attempting to mend their ways, however Nottingham Knockers are not part of any recognised rehabilitation scheme.

Please warn your neighbours, particularly elderly or vulnerable neighbours, not to open the door to strangers or buy or sell on the doorstep. Some doorstep callers may offer poor quality goods at inflated prices and if a caller is not genuine, they may be gathering information for future crime.

Please remember to follow the Countryside Code to help everyone respect, protect and enjoy the outdoors. Various fields around the village have footpaths crossing them, please remember they may have cattle, sheep, lambs or other wildlife in them.

Tesco Bags of Help Scheme – Aynho Active Outdoor Exercise Trail

We have applied and been successful in getting our proposed outdoor exercise equipment in-store for **May & June** in the **Brackley** Tesco stores. Our similar initiative in Waitrose where it was a share of £1000 has also raised a sum around £250 – yet to be confirmed.
