



Rev. Sue Cooper writes--

Dear All, Throughout May we saw our lanes, countryside and woods come alive with fresh green leaves declaring that summer is on the way. Our seasons in the UK are so special and they help us to take stock of our lives as the months and seasons roll on. We find security in things that remain the same, such as our seasons, and find comfort in nostalgia, when we think of the past. Do you remember as a child during school assembly learning The Lord's Prayer and being able to recite it off by heart. It is probably the one thing that we all remember from school assemblies, and perhaps a few hymns. As I write, we are planning services of Evening Prayer to be said in our Churches during the ten days between Ascension Day 30th May and Pentecost 9th June, using The Lord's Prayer as our focus. It is part of The Arch Bishop of Canterbury's 'Thy Kingdom Come' campaign. Please do come and join us on one of the evenings, you will be most welcome. And it will give you an opportunity to reconnect with The Lord's Prayer; which can help to bring a sense of order and security to our busy lives. Jesus taught this prayer to his disciples when they asked him how they should pray. I believe that if you said this prayer daily to God, quietly, and slowly, you would find a new sense of being connected to God in your daily life in a very short space of time. Why not give it a try?

"The Lord's Prayer"

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; Thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Another thing that has enriched me this month is how wonderful it is to hear our Church bells on a **Sunday morning**. They ring to the praise and glory of God, and to call us to worship. It is good to know that this tradition carries on and we all enjoy hearing them ring on other occasions too, such as Weddings. Bell ringing has a lot of benefits. It keeps you fit, it is very sociable as you work in a team, and you don't have belong to Church to do it (although that might benefit you too). Village Speeding Issues

The moveable vehicle activated sign (MVAS) has been rotated around the village and initial stats are:

Charlton Road (The Butts) Weekly movements: 7250

Average Speed: 29.3mph 85% ave speed*: 34.8mph Worst offender: **65mph**

Croughton Road Weekly movements: 65100

Average Speed: 28.3mph 85% ave speed*: 33.1mph Worst offender: **65mph**

Banbury Road Weekly movements: 62600

Average Speed: 29.4mph 85% ave speed*: 36.3mph Worst offender: **80mph**

Charlton Road (Portway entrance) Weekly movements: 7790

Average Speed: 29.4mph 85% ave speed*: 41.9mph Worst offender: **70mph** * the 85th percentile speed defines the speed that 85 percent of drivers will drive at or below under free-flowing conditions.

At the Annual Village Meeting in April the general opinion in the village hall was that the level of speeding is lower since the introduction of the calming measures a few years ago – we suspect a small number of persistent offenders.

Unfortunately, sightings of village residents speeding is disappointing.

Village Parking, Vans and Commercial Vehicles

It has been brought to the Councils attention that recently a number of commercial vehicles have appeared in residential parking spaces. Some newer developments in the village such as Cartwright Gardens, The Butts, College Fields and School End may have restrictive covenants in place on their parking spaces prohibiting the parking of Caravans, Boats and Commercial Vehicles from using these spaces. These are designed to protect the character of the development as well as the village and hopefully give residents some protection against large recreational or commercial vehicles becoming an eyesore to their neighbours. Landlords renting properties should be aware of these covenants and ensure that their tenants are aware they should not be parking this type of vehicle in these spaces.

Blandford Blackfly

Blandford flies are approximately 2–3mm long making them only slightly larger than midges. The females lay their 200–300 eggs in the cracks of steep river banks in June and July. These eggs then lie dormant through the winter. In the spring the larvae emerge and in May the adults emerge. They are now on the wing through May, June and July flying close to the ground and ranging approximately 1km from water. Males only feed on nectar but females need a blood meal before they can lay their eggs. Bites tend to be on the lower limbs and can cause an allergic reaction and/or get easily infected. Please try and keep covered and use insect repellent.
