

### **BIODIVERSITY GROUP**

#### **BE TICK AWARE!**

Each species of tick prefers to feed on the blood of a different animal. Sheep ticks are the ones most likely to bite humans but hedgehog, fox and badger ticks will as well. Although the UK tick cannot survive in your home and reproduce, the brown dog tick, which has arrived from Europe can. Ticks wait on tall grasses, bushes and trees for a host to brush past. It then climbs aboard and moves to somewhere warm and dark before starting to



feed. Some ticks carry and transmit a whole range of diseases picked up from their hosts which are dangerous to both you and your pet. Lyme disease is one of them and needs to be treated as soon as possible with antibiotics. You may think because you only walk your dog around the village it will not get ticks but it can as other animals who do go across the fields bring them in. Ticks need to be removed carefully using fine tipped tweezers or a special tick removal tool available from your vets or pet shop – leaving part of the tick behind can cause an infection. Stay safe and regularly do a tick check on yourself, your children and your pets.
