Can you believe that we are into August already! I always think August is a strange month. It's as if we enter a different time zone where nothing seems routine; Christmas is the other time this happens, but unlike Christmas, August is a time when everything slows down. Traditionally August is holiday time, and can be a time when we can take some of the busy-ness out of life, (unless you're a farmer).

This can be a luxury for many people nowadays. But hopefully we try to take some time out for recreation, and when we do this we feel ourselves coming back into balance and gaining a better perspective on life. We feel re-created through our recreation. It has always been Gods intention that we all take regular times for rest and recreation, and in so doing we are refreshed and renewed, and often it's what keeps us sane and well.

But time to stop and rest is something that our fast paced world knows little about; but never the less it is God's intention for us. In fact it is so important that he did it himself. Our creation story in Genesis said that on the 7th day God rested after all his work and he blessed the 7th day and made it Holy and to be set apart from the rest of the week. This is Gods way of teaching us that we all need a rest day once a week. The bible calls this a 'Sabbath', and it is for our benefit. It is a day to stop work and do something that is recreational and life giving. Try to make a date in your diary to always have a 'Sabbath' or 'rest day' once a week. It doesn't have to be on Sunday; mine is on Friday's, but it does need to be a day that is different from the rest of the week and set apart for rest and renewal, that way you will be able to reconnect with yourself, and with God.

This is sometimes hard to do, especially if you are looking after young children, or are a carer for somebody else. But it is still important that you try to schedule in even small windows of time into your week so that you can have some rest and renewal, or some 'me time' as it's called nowadays. This is essential for your own wellbeing. However we do it, all of us need to take time out of our busy weeks if we are to stay well physically, mentally and spiritually. This was something Jesus did regularly. Jesus led a very busy and active life, but even so, we read in the Gospels that he often took himself off to a 'quiet or solitary' place to pray and get some space, so that he could be refreshed and renewed for the busy days ahead. If Jesus needed to do this, then so do we. So this holiday time, enjoy your rest, where ever you are, and whatever you are doing - but come back determined to look after yourself better by having a regular Sabbath day of rest and renewal. A day when you stop work and do something you enjoy. We all need it, and it is God's will for your life!!

## **Newbottle & Charlton School Update.**

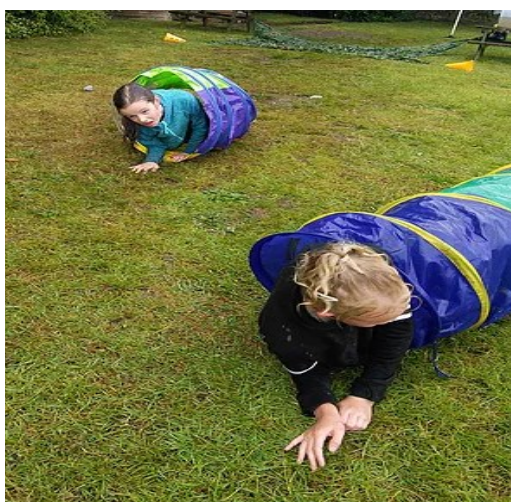
As we came to the last few weeks at school one might have hoped that the weather would have been sunny and warm – alas, this was not the case and the rain meant many events were postponed and even cancelled.

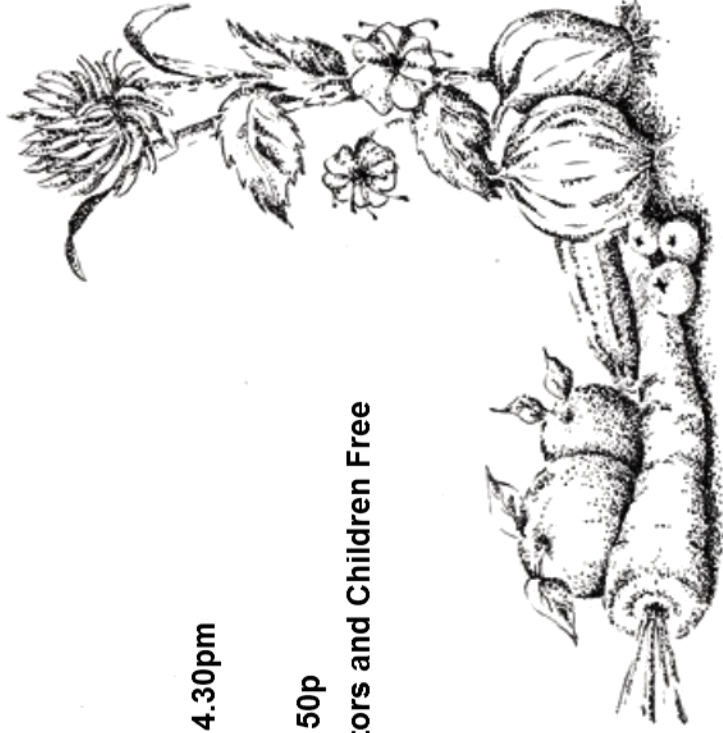

#### RULES OF THE SHOW

1. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor, unless otherwise stated in the rules. Exhibitors need not be members of The Aynho Gardening Club, but if not, must be resident in Aynho.

2. The entrance fee for each exhibit shall be 20p, payable when the entry form is handed in.

3. Only one entry will be allowed in each class for each person.

4. Entries must be staged between 9.30 am. and 11.15 am.. on Saturday.

#### This rule will be strictly enforced

5. Prize money will be First = 50p, Second = 30p, Third = 20p in each class.

6. Prize money will be paid between 3.00 p.m. and 4.00 p.m. on the day of the show.

7. Exhibitors must bring their own staging material, i.e. vases, plates, etc. For the purpose of this show a vase will be a container which is higher than it is wide.

8. No exhibits are to be removed from the tables while the show is open, except if requested to do so by the show manager or a member of the committee.

9. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.

10. Judging will be by independent Judges and will take place from 11.15 am.

The Judge's decision is final.

11. All details & measurements in the schedules must be adhered to.

12. Any objections must be made to the Show Secretary, Mrs Carol McClellan, either directly or via another committee member.

13. Non-competitive exhibits will be welcome, subject to display room. Please inform Mrs Carol McClellan before the day of the show.

### The Royal Horticultural Society's Banksian Medal

This special medal from The Royal Horticultural Society is to be awarded to the person with the largest amount of prize money in the whole of the horticultural classes at the show, classes 1 to 55. Competitors who have won the medal in the previous two years are not eligible to win the medal this year.

# AYNHO GARDENING CLUB

## ENTRY FORM

## Filling

2 egg yolks

1 knob of butter

4 medium onions -sliced

15ml / 1tbs Balsamic vinegar

5ml /1 tsp brown sugar

100 ml double cream

100g/4oz Cheddar cheese

## Pastry

1. Sift the flour into a mixing bowl
2. Add the butter and lard, cut into pieces and rub in until fine breadcrumb
3. Add enough water to draw the mixture together
4. Wrap in cling film and chill for 20-30 mins
5. Roll out and line a 20cm / 8ins flan tin or flan ring
6. Line the pastry case with baking paper and baking beans. Chill again for 15mins
7. Bake blind for 20min at 200C / Gas Mark 6 for 20 mins
8. Meanwhile make the filling

## Filling

1. Heat the butter in a pan and cook the onions slowly for 20 mins stirring occasionally
2. Add the vinegar and sugar and cook until sticky and golden, about 10 mins and all the liquid has evaporated
3. Allow to cool
4. Beat the eggs and cream, carefully add the cheese and onions, season with salt and pepper
