RULES OF THE SHOW

1. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor, unless otherwise stated in the rules. Exhibitors need not be members of The Aynho Gardening Club, but if not, must be resident in Aynho.
2. The entrance fee for each exhibit shall be 20p, payable when the entry form is handed in.
3. Only one entry will be allowed in each class for each person.
4. Entries must be staged between 9.30 am. and 11.15 am.. on Saturday.
This rule will be strictly enforced
5. Prize money will be First = 50p, Second = 30p, Third = 20p in each class.
6. Prize money will be paid between 3.00 p.m. and 4.00 p.m. on the day of the show.
7. Exhibitors must bring their own staging material, i.e. vases, plates, etc. For the purpose of this show
a vase will be a container which is higher than it is wide.
8. No exhibits are to be removed from the tables while the show is open, except if requested to do so by the show manager or a member of the committee.
9. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
10. Judging will be by independent Judges and will take place from 11.15 am.
The Judge's decision is final.
11. All details & measurements in the schedules must be adhered to.
12. Any objections must be made to the Show Secretary, Mrs Carol McClellan, either directly or via another committee member.
13. Non-competitive exhibits will be welcome, subject to display room. Please inform Mrs Carol McClellan before the day of the show.

CLASSES

Flowers

1. One vase of hardy perennial border flowers
2. One vase or bowl of annuals
3. One bowl of cut herbs, decorative and/or culinary
4. One vase or bowl of any garden flowers and/or foliage, may include bulbs, shrubs, etc.
5. One specimen flower, not a rose, sweet pea, dahlia or gladioli

Roses

6. One specimen bloom, any variety
7. One specimen bloom, judged for perfume
8. One stem cluster flower bush (floribunda)
9. One stem of miniature roses

Dahlias

10. One specimen bloom
11. Vase of four dahlias (4 different varieties)
12. Vase of three dahlias, decorative
13. Vase of three dahlias, cactus
14. Vase of three dahlias, pom-pom (under 2 ins)
15. Vase of three dahlias ball (over 2 ins)
16. Vase of 3 dahlias of one variety (different to classes 12-15)

Gladioli

17. One specimen spike
18. Three gladioli of one variety
19. Four gladioli of mixed varieties

Chrysanthemums

20. Vase of three sprays

Sweet Peas

21. Bowl of annual sweet peas
22. Bowl of perennial sweet peas

Pansies

23. Four pansies staged on a box

Fuchsias

24. Three sprays of mixed or same fuchsia

Vegetables

25. 5 tomatoes, with calyx
26. 6 Cherry tomatoes with calyx
27. 5 white potatoes
28. 5 coloured potatoes
29. 2 table marrows
30. 5 runner beans, with stalks
31. 5 French beans, with stalks
32. The longest runner bean
33. 3 courgettes, with or without stalk & flower (max 6ins excluding stalk & flower)
34. 3 beetroot, with 2ins of leaf stem
35. 6 shallots
36. 3 white onions under 200g
37. 3 white onions over 200g
38. 3 red onions under 200g
39. 3 carrots, with 2ins of leaf stem
40. 1 cucumber, greenhouse/frame
41. 1 cucumber, grown outside
42. 2 lettuces
43. 2 sweetcorn with outer leaves still intact but peeled back to show the seeds on the cob
44. Three vegetables chosen from the following six: 3 potatoes / 2 tomatoes / 4 shallots / 4 runner beans / 3 carrots with 2ins of leaf stem / 3 beetroot with 2ins of leaf stem
Vegetables to be shown in a tray not exceeding 18ins by 12ins overall - only parsley may be used as a dressing
45. Two of one type of vegetable not covered in any of the above classes
46. A trug of any mixed vegetables and herbs
47. The longest marrow
48. The funniest shaped vegetable

Fruit

- (All hard or stoned fruit must have stalks attached)
49. Plate of 6 plums
 50. Plate of 3 dessert apples
 51. Plate of 3 cooking apples
 52. Plate of 3 pears
 53. Plate of 24 blackberries, with calyx attached
 54. Plate of soft fruit (not blackberries)
 55. Plate of 6 apricots (no stalks)

Floral Art (See Floral Art Rules Below)

56. An arrangement of flowers in an unusual container – (no larger than 40cm wide x 30cm deep size)
 - a. Natural plant material must predominate
 - b. Flowers and foliage do not necessarily have to have been grown by the exhibitor
 - c. A back-cloth may be used

Homecraft

57. Alexa's Pickled Onion and Cheddar Tart (set recipe)
58. A Cake that includes at least one vegetable in the recipe (say what)
59. 6 Ginger Biscuits
60. One jar of chutney (dated at least 3 months old)
61. One jar of pickles (dated at least 3 months old)
62. One jar of apricot jam
63. One jar of jam, other than apricot
64. One jar of marmalade
65. A Sour Dough Bread - not made in a breadmaking machine or from a packet mix

Family Class (Children & Parents)

66. Save the Planet- Make a Fish / Sea Creature from recycled materials
67. A decorated hard boiled egg

Special Exhibits (Children may enter any of the classes)

68. A colour photograph 'A Farming Scene' (max 7 ins by 5 ins unmounted)
69. A colour photograph 'Summer Abundance' (max 7 ins by 5 ins unmounted)
70. A hand-knitted garment (item not exhibited previously)
71. An article of needlework/embroidery (item not exhibited previously)
72. A small article made from wood (item not exhibited previously)
73. A craft item not covered in any of the above classes (item not exhibited previously)

The Aynho Gardening Club Shield donated by Ron Sawbridge, will be awarded to the Exhibitor who wins the highest number of First Prizes.

The George Ashbrook Trophy will be awarded for the best flower in the show.

The Best Vegetable Cup donated by Mr T Godfrey, will be awarded for the best vegetable in the show.

The Homecraft Plate will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest amount of prize money in the Floral Art and Homecraft categories (Classes 56-65)
The above awards will be held for one year and cannot be held outright.

The Royal Horticultural Society's Banksian Medal

This special medal from The Royal Horticultural Society is to be awarded to the person with the largest amount of prize money in the whole of the horticultural classes at the show, classes 1 to 55. Competitors who have won the medal in the previous two years are not eligible to win the medal this year.
