Pastoral Letter......Hello Everyone.

I hope you have enjoyed the long days of Summer, and hopefully we will have many more warm, sunny days throughout Autumn,. September is a wonderful mix of old and new. Summer is growing old and tired, but the Children are preparing to go back to school for a new academic year, and one of the first things the schools will be arranging are their Harvest Assemblies. Harvest is one of our major Festivals in the Church, and a good opportunity for us to give thanks for all the food and drink we have. It wasn't until I came to Northamptonshire some years ago that I really made the connection between the food on the shelf in Tesco's, and the hard working Farmers. Being a Townie I rarely saw a tractor, or combine harvester, and I rarely saw fields of crops growing, so I took food for granted. Last year I had the pleasure of doing an extended placement with Emmanuel Church Weston Favell, and they run a food bank every Wednesday morning. I was shocked at the high demand for food parcels, and humbled by the cheerful, kind people who volunteered their time and energy to run the whole operation. It's hard to imagine not having enough food to eat. My parents lived through World War 2 and remember the hardships of rationing, but unless you have experienced it yourself, it's hard to imagine. I did however manage to really empathise with the food bank clients. Many of them were hard working people who were either down on their luck, or were in fact working, and still not able to make ends meet. The food parcels were a lifeline and gratefully received, but it did make me wonder how we have come to such a desperate place as a nation. Food shortage is not a problem in the UK, but none the less, it is a reality for many families, and like I said, unless we experience something ourselves, it is hard to imagine what it is like. I would like to invite you all to one of our Harvest Festival services. It's a great way to thank God for the crops, and the food we eat, and it's a good way to reflect on, acknowledge, and pray for the farming community and all those involved in the food chain, and their hard work to bring food to our tables. Even if you are not usually a Church goer, we would love to see you, and welcome you to share in this special festival. All the Churches will be gratefully receiving contributions of goods and produce, which will then be either auctioned in the case of perishable foods, and the proceeds given to Charity, or donated to local food banks and local food distributers, who will pass it on and bless others with it. From your PARISH COUNCIL

Aynho Street Lights – Award of Contract

The Parish Council is responsible for the provision and maintenance of the 36 streetlights that are situated within the Village (including Aynho Wharf). The lights are provided for the pedestrians. We pay the electricity and maintenance from the Aynho Precept (part of your Council Tax Bill) and currently spend £2,650 for electricity and £450 in routine maintenance plus additional costs if current light fittings fail. This represents about 10% of our annual budget.

In November 2018 the Parish Council undertook a consultation about replacing the existing streetlights within the village; modern streetlights, using LED technology, are about 80-90% cheaper to operate. Following consultation we sought four companies to tender for streetlight replacement and at the July PC meeting selected a contractor to undertake the works, which is expected to be undertaken in October 2019.

The contractor selected is Zeta Specialist Lighting Ltd, based in Bicester.

The Parish Council is to replace all the current lights as most of the fittings within the village are old and utilitarian and as such not particularly in keeping with a Conservation Village. There is also a mix of fittings and light colours. All new lights will be of a Heritage Style and thus a uniform feel throughout the village. Where possible existing columns will be retained and painted black and where lights are mounted on disused electricity posts – these will be replaced with new columns and lights. New lights will be "top down" thus reducing light pollution and will dim to 50% power from midnight until 5am and will be "warm" light colour at 2700K.

Having selected the contractor and light fittings the expected electricity bill will now be £450 – a saving of 83% per year in our case. The annual maintenance cost will also reduce significantly.
