#### Christmas Pastoral Letter December 2019:

Sue Cooper... Rector writes:

There is a song played every year at Christmas that is blasted out in the shops and on the telly, and it goes, "It's the most wonderful time of the year!".

Children would agree with that I am sure, but sadly something of the wonder and joy of Christmas has been lost in our culture and society as the story of Christ's birth has been side lined from Christmas, and it has become much more secularised and consumer driven. So much so that many people's understanding of Jesus is that he was just a good man, and many folk think he was just a great teacher and philosopher, and they will try to live their lives by the values he taught, but as great as these understandings about Jesus are, they miss the point of Jesus' life.

The point of Jesus' life was to show us the way back to God. Jesus is much more than just a good man or a great teacher, because He actually claimed to be God's son, and claimed that he had been sent to the world to be our Saviour because God loves us. We live in such a complex world, with great good demonstrated by people, but also great evil by others. Because of the evil in the world many folk cannot bring themselves to believe that there is a God who loves His creation, and who loves the people of the world. Many folk would say if God is so good and loving...why doesn't he do something?

2000 years ago in Bethlehem God did do something, He sent his one and only son Jesus to show us the way to live, and the way back to Gods heart. And the world would be a very different place if everyone tried to live how Jesus taught us to.

Every Christmas we hear the story of Jesus's birth, and for many it is heard only as folk lore or myth, or worse still as a fairy-tale. But none the less every year among the tinsel and glitter of the celebrations, the baby of Bethlehem appears in our Carol services, in our children's School Nativity plays, and is proclaimed from every Church in the land. In reality we can only imagine what it might have been like that 1<sup>st</sup> Christmas among the dusty busy streets of Bethlehem. But if you will allow yourself to believe the good news the Angels and Shepherds proclaimed, if you will open your heart and mind to God, and to see Jesus as more than just a good man or great teacher, then Christmas is indeed the most wonderful time of the year. It is wonderful because Jesus is more than that, He is the light of the world, the hope of the nations, God's very own son and our Saviour. Have a very blessed, peaceful and joyful Christmas, with love Rev Sue.

## WI - Usually 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday. BUT Christmas Party Friday December 6<sup>th</sup>.



#### **Ambulance Response times**

999 calls from Aynho are routed (unless very busy) to East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS) as we are officially in Northamptonshire. There is, however, a single, linked allocation system that means EMAS and South Central Ambulance Service (SCAS) are able to communicate and allocate resources appropriately and, therefore, if there is an ambulance at Adderbury (SCAS depot) or a SCAS unit close to the village it will be sent. This also applies to first responders, volunteers that can arrive very quickly and perform life-saving first aid such as CPR.

Ambulance call-outs do have several categories. Only Cat 1 and 2 (7 minutes on average for Cat 1 with 90% within 15 minutes, 18 minutes for Category 2) have target times and these are for very serious life-threatening situations such as sepsis and stroke. For others (and these can obviously be very distressing such as when in pain) resources are allocated on availability but can be, if they are busy, some hours before they arrive. Consider calling 111 at weekends or evenings after 6.30pm as you can often get an urgent appointment at a treatment centre or out-of-hours GP and can, if necessary, arrange an ambulance if required.

#### Planning Applications: None.

<u>Aynho Watch</u> – In an effort to combat door-step cold-callers and others, such as so called "Nottingham Knockers", and keep all Aynho residents safe the Parish Council has had the **enclosed** "*Aynho Says No To Cold Callers*" window stickers produced. We would urge as many households as possible to display this sticker. Even if you don't feel that you are personally vulnerable, it would be great if Aynho displayed a united front and encouraged cold callers to move on elsewhere. We are very lucky that Aynho is mainly a safe community, but we are not immune to crime and these stickers are designed to help prevent it.

<u>Aynho Street Lights</u> – Installation begins. Residents will have noticed that the installation of the replacement streetlights has started. Full details were included in the September newsletter so I will not repeat them other than to say that all the lights in the village are being replaced with modern energy efficient heritage style lights. Where possible existing columns will be retained and painted black and where lights are mounted on disused electricity posts – these are being replaced with new columns and lights. The current state of the project is as follows:

15 columns which are reused have been converted and are live now.

9 new replacement columns have been installed and are awaiting connection by the local power company.

- 1 Column (Village Hall awaits conversion)
- 9 lights to be fitted to houses and electricity poles will be installed later this month.

Some will be live immediately on the day of conversion and some will require connection by the local power company. It is expected all the lights will be operational by early December. Please note that the columns are all due to be painted black – but this work will not be undertaken until Spring 2020 when the weather improves. The new lights will be "top down", thus reducing light pollution and dim to 70% power from 22.30pm then 40% power from 0030midnight until 5.0am and will be a "warm " light colour at 2700K. The expected electricity bill will now be £450 – a saving of 83% per year in our case. The annual maintenance costs will also reduce significantly.

All Parish Council Meetings are open to the Public for transparency. The next Parish Council Meeting is in the Village Hall on Monday 2nd December 7.30pm.
