

Rev Sue's Pastoral Letter April 2020

Dear Friends, I hope you are all as well as can be expected and are bearing up under these very difficult circumstances we are experiencing with Covid-19. As you may be aware, the Arch Bishop of Canterbury has instructed that all public worship must cease in our Churches until further notice. This is very distressing to many of us, however we must keep things in perspective, Covid-19 is very infectious and potentially life threatening, and so a period of imposed restrictions will not be a bad thing, and we know that this situation will not last forever.

Our Churches will remain open for private prayer, so if you are not self-isolating at home you may want to come into Church to pray, or just sit quietly. On a practical level we are being asked to practice social distancing, which will mean making sure that we are not sat or stood within 2 metres of somebody else, and do please respect others need to just be sitting quietly. I understand that this is difficult for all of us, but for the time being this must become our 'new normal' so to speak. And it is the loving thing to do to keep everyone as safe as possible.

I will be sending out messages regularly, and adding resources to help you pray and worship at home, and please do email me if you are not already on my list and would like to receive these. Coronavirus and Our Village

Yes, we are in the midst of a public health and economic crisis. This <u>will</u> be a temporary situation and if we all play our part, we can delay the spread of the Coronavirus known as Covid19. We already have a strong community spirit in our village, and many will be receiving support from friends, neighbours or family. Your Parish Council will also provide support and advice where needed or as directed by Northamptonshire Council or the Government as indicated in the letter accompanying the Annual Village Survey.

If you do have to self-isolate or need help and support over the coming weeks and months, and require help with shopping, meals, deliveries or a friendly listening ear, then your Parish Council can help link those willing to volunteer with those needing help.

If you would like to be linked with a volunteer or if you could offer help, contact Andy Anderson on 07768 294775 or 0330 113 6008, any member of the Parish Council in your area or the Parish Clerk Chris Wilson. Andy is our local healthcare representative, is Chair of the Deddington Health Centre Patient Group and, until recently, worked for the 111 service. We also have a number of former healthcare workers in the village and we will, if required form a wider committee to handle any escalation of the situation in the coming weeks.

In the meantime, we will be posting news and updates on the local situation on our web site www.aynho.org, on the Aynho Community Facebook page on village notice boards and in the monthly newsletter.

We have already had some questions about whether older residents should even go out. The scare stories and amount of information from the media can be daunting and confusing so go to the Public Health England web site for definitive advice. If you don't have internet access then contact a neighbour or someone who does. Alternatively, the Parish Council will be updating notice boards or feel free to call Andy for support.

There are already some great examples, both across the Country and in our village, of people connecting with and helping others. The Parish Council have decided to give our collective actions a label — Aynho Community Connect. We believe, amongst all the gloom and doom, we wil come out the other side of this and there is an opportunity to build a more cohesive and connected village community for the long term. We hope we can engage with those who have felt they didn't have the time or inclination to become involved in village life, and this is especially true for our younger residents. If we all pull together, think creatively and support each other Aynho will be an even better place to live than it is now.
