




#### Pastoral Letter March 2022: Revd Sue Cooper writes:

Dear Friends,

Spring has sprung, and how happy we are to see the beautiful snowdrops, daffodils and crocus's which herald the beginning of brighter longer days to come. But as I write this (on Feb 19<sup>th</sup>) we have just had another storm with high winds. Storm Dudley! During the night I was kept awake by the howling of the wind and the banging and crashing of goodness knows what outside. I was worried what I might wake up to in the morning, but strangely, all was well and nothing had moved!!, just a few branches were slightly bent. However just two days later we had Storm "Eunice" and parts of the UK were severely affected. Some property and trees were ripped up and thrown down; such is the ferocity and unpredictable nature of these things. But I think we are all becoming more resilient in the face of these events since having to learn how to manage our lives through the pandemic and its variants.

Life can be unpredictable sometimes; when storms of circumstances keep coming at us, threatening our peace and wellbeing, or the peace and wellbeing of our loved ones. These can be storms of sickness, storms of redundancy or financial hardship, storms of personal pain due to conflict within our families or workplace or schools, or a storm of pain that we feel for our children and loved ones, when they are beset by the troubles of life. Sometimes it feels as though the storms just keep coming, with ever increasing strength, and threaten to overwhelm us; this can be both frightening and wearying.

I often hear folk say that all they want in life is peace. Peace of heart and mind for themselves and their loved ones, but where is it to be found?

Although not fashionable, routines and good habits are invaluable for helping us to stay on an "even keel" and to keep things in perspective. Sadly, in our day and age, if we are not constantly "improving ourselves" or "challenging ourselves" with endless life goals we are thought of as rigid and stale, but this is just not true, because some things in life do need to remain constant and permanent for a sense of wellbeing to be felt.

Church and religion has come under a lot of flak in recent years, with some folk seeing them as part of an old institutional way of life that needs throwing overboard. And whilst there are certainly some things in Church and religion that do need to give way to new life, it is wrong to "throw the baby out with the bath water" so to speak. Having faith in God, and practicing religious routines, such as praying daily and attending Church weekly, are solid foundations on which we can build our lives upon. People have been doing this for centuries. Because when everything around is in turmoil and the storms of life are battering us, and when we look for something or someone to cling to or escape to ... **God is there** ... and so is The Church.

Practicing holy habits such as praying daily and attending Church every week can be the very things that keep us standing strong and steady in the hard times. Because when we pray we bring God into our situations, and then we no longer feel alone in it all; trying to hold everything together in our own strength while waiting for the storm to pass. And at Church we experience a warm welcome, and kindness from others, who understand that life is sometimes hard. But together with our friends and with God, we can face any storm, no matter how bad. And by sharing our troubles with God and others we may well find that the things that are troubling us the most turn out to be just "storms in a teacup" and, after a very short while, the storm blows over, and all is well again.

## **AYNHO PARISH COUNCIL**

#### Traffic Passing Through Aynho Village

There's little doubt the volumes and speed of traffic through the village on the B4100 has appreciably increased in recent months. And, with large scale development (see below) along with more general construction and building works across Oxfordshire and Northamptonshire, Aynho Parish Council are concerned about the negative impact this will have for residents living in the village. For the year ahead (and beyond), one of the Parish Council's principal objectives will be to challenge Oxfordshire, Cherwell and West Northants councils, Highways, Planning and other influencing bodies, hoping to enlist their support to help alleviate some of the problems of traffic through the village. What success our efforts will have is yet to be seen, decisions are made by other authorities with very limited consultation with the Parish Council.

Right now, we need your help!

Aynho Parish Council Objects to Planned Warehousing & Distribution Centre Development at Baynard's Green (3.7 miles distance).

## We encourage all Aynho Residents to Respond!

Currently there's a planning application for a large scale warehousing and distribution centre submitted to Cherwell District Council. The scale of the development is very (very) large and its impact during construction and when built and operating will be significant. Given its location, adjacent to M40 Junction 10, A43 and B4100 - which connects Banbury to Bicester via Aynho - the levels of HGV and LCV traffic is likely to increase significantly. We already have problems with too much HGV and LCV traffic, any increase will have a disproportionately negative impact on the village and living here. To help protect the village the very least the Parish Council is calling for is a HGV weight limit and routing agreement away from the B4100 (West), to avoid Aynho becoming even more of a 'rat run' between Bicester, Banbury and the M40.

The Parish Council strongly objects to this and similar developments and we'd encourage all residents to do the same. We'd like you to add your own voice regarding this planning application.

# **AYNHO'S PARK CLUB DRAW**

Enter the lottery for the next 12-months and support our sports and recreation facilities

Dear Villager/Park Club Draw Player

The Aynho Park Club Draw is our village lottery. It exists purely to raise money to help maintain the Pavilion, sports field, exercise equipment, tennis court and amenity track which is such an asset to our little community. Residents regularly celebrate birthdays, weddings, family get togethers here as well as taking casual walks with neighbours and friends. Children learn to ride their bikes on the safe track with no danger of traffic and a nice soft landing if they come off. Residents of all ages try and keep fit and local clubs connect us with other villages and the wider community.

Since the start of this, the 21<sup>st</sup> century, the PCD has cost just £12 per year to play. A cost of £1 a month, with half the proceeds going to Aynho Active to maintain the facilities, and the other half put back into the pot for a lucky player to win a share of each month. However, £12 doesn't go as far as it did 22 years ago, and so we are going to increase the cost of playing to £18 per year. This amounts to a 50% increase, but still just a small investment of £1.50 per month. The money raised goes nowhere except into maintaining the existing facilities and into the winning pot. Since 2021 we have run the PCD from April to March to avoid taxing your purse immediately post-Christmas, and to make going door to door drumming up players more pleasant for our volunteers!

We hope you understand our reasoning and continue to play if you already are an existing player; and decide to come on board if you are a new player. The cost to play has increased, but with that should come an increased prize pot!

Now to the specifics! If you already have a standing order or have paid £12 via bank transfer for 2022, many thanks. However, please can we ask that you transfer a further £6 if you wish to play for the full year? Otherwise, we will be delighted to keep you in the draw from April to October. For all new players or those who haven't paid yet, please transfer £18 to the following bank account:
