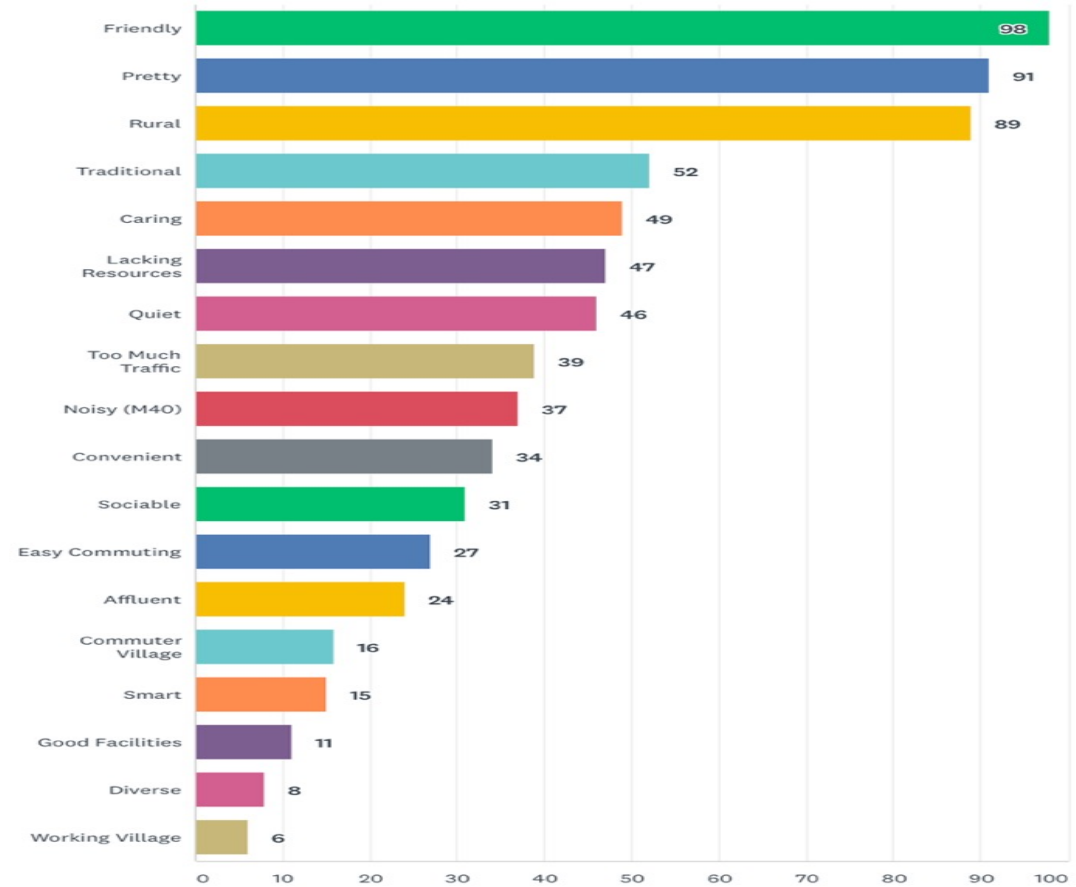

- Lacking Resources

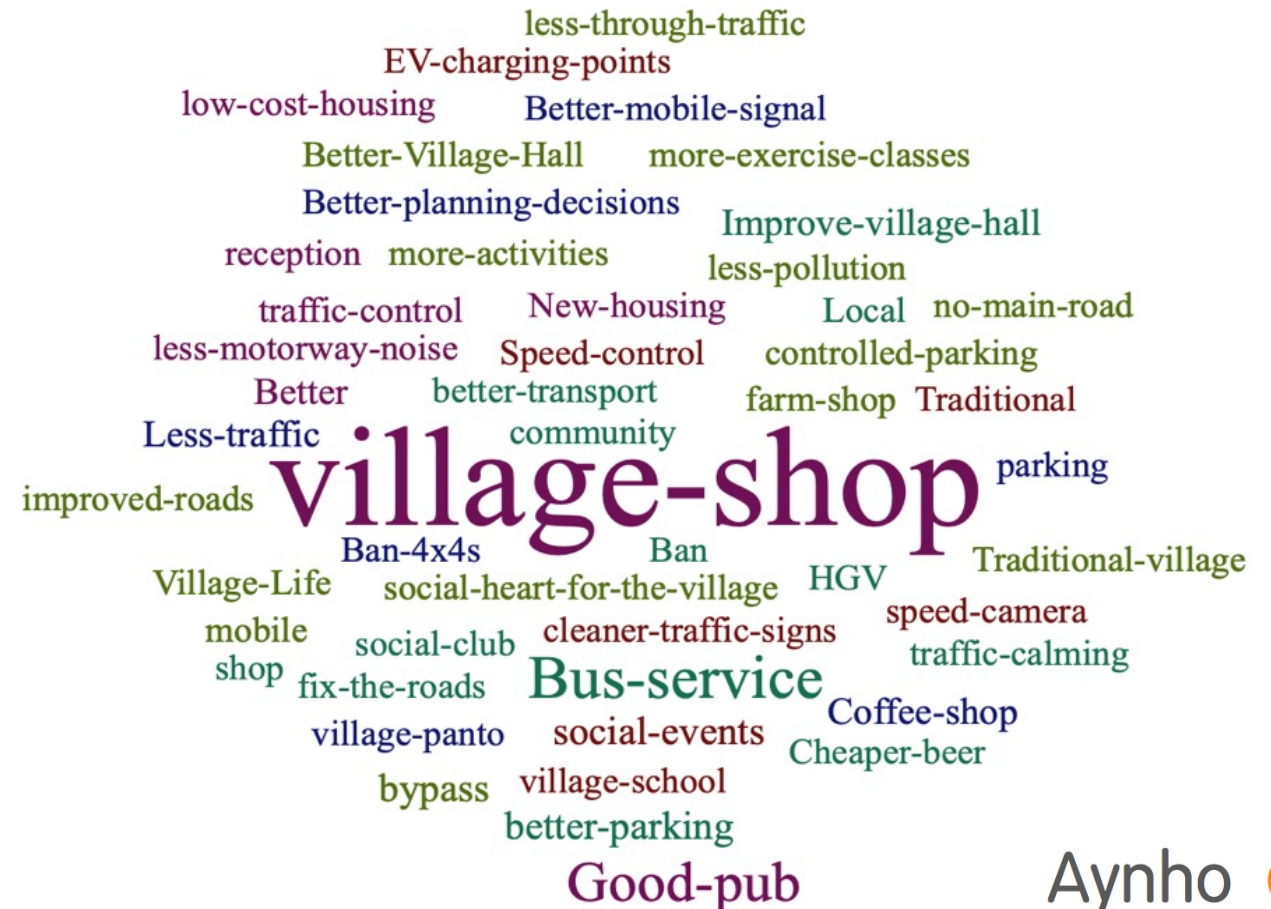

Results from the Village Survey will help inform aspects of the Parish Council's work and decision-making



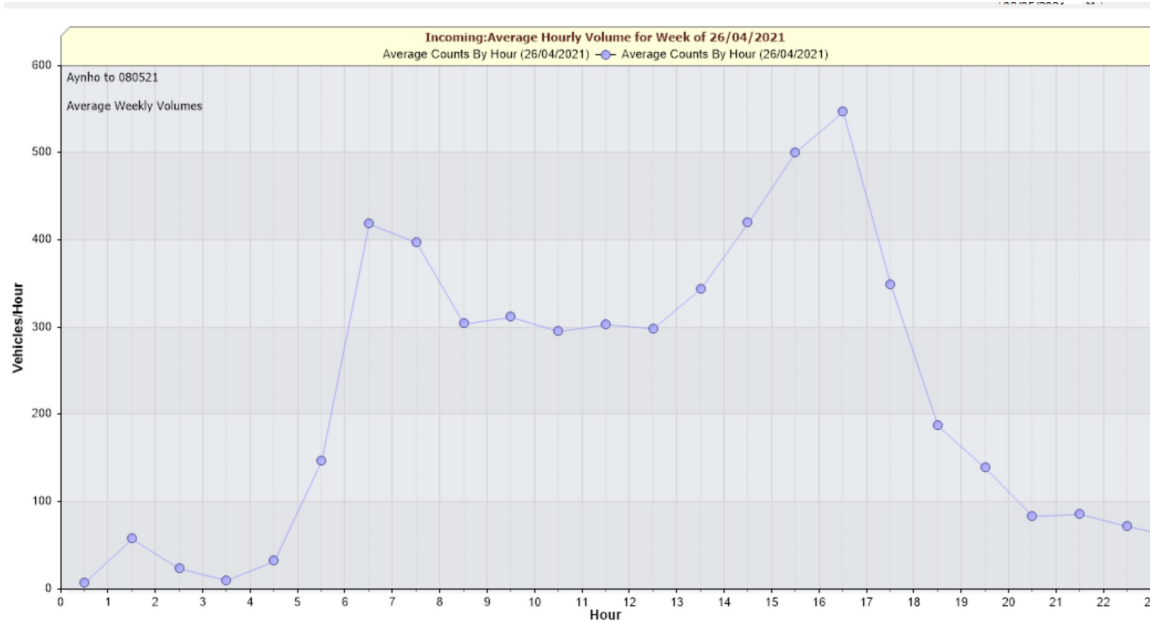
Aynho Eco

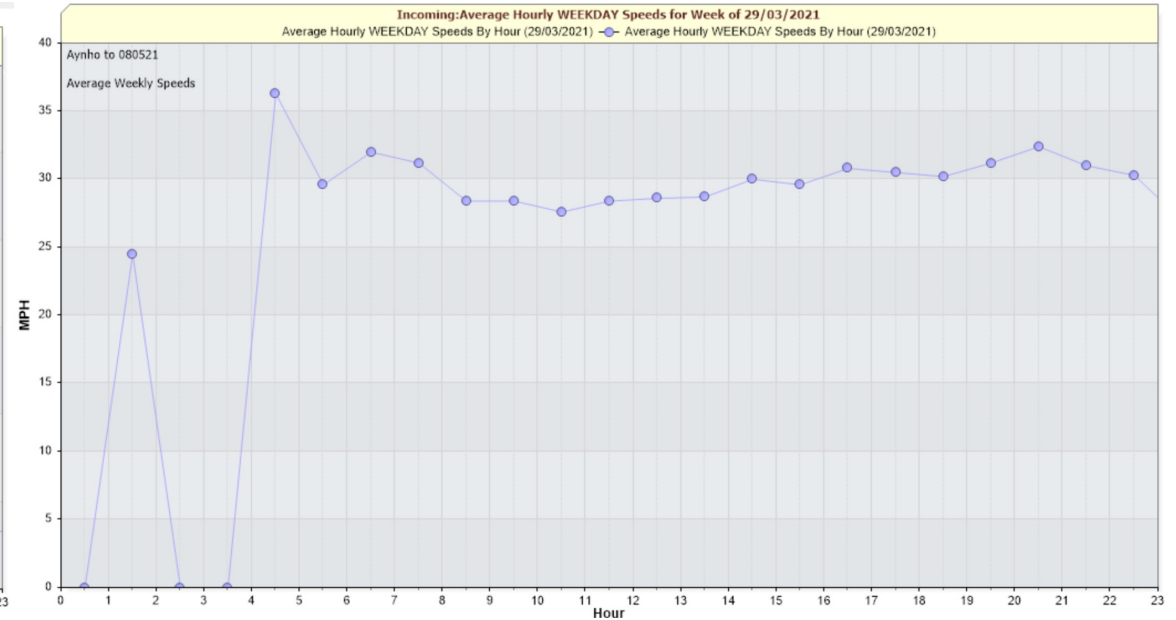
Ideas include:

 - Household Insulation and other improves

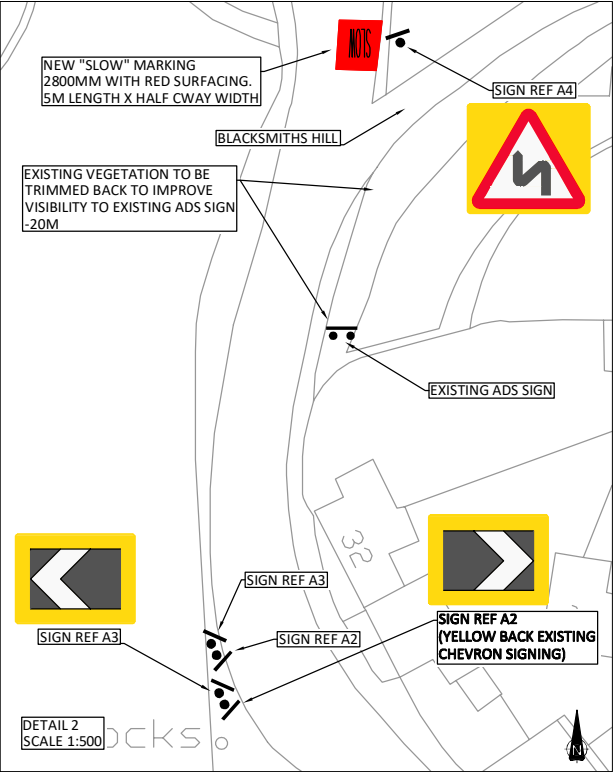
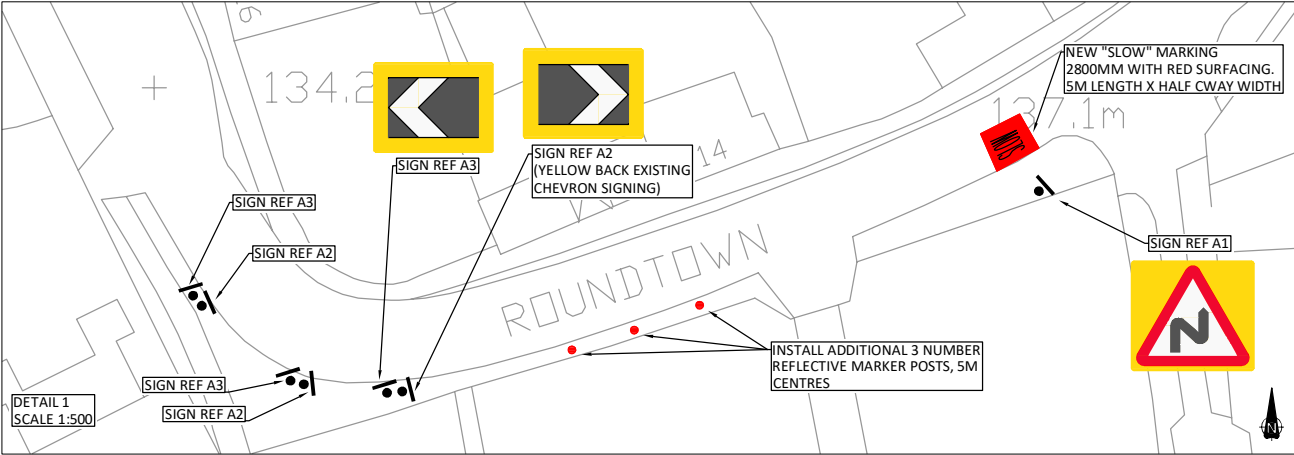
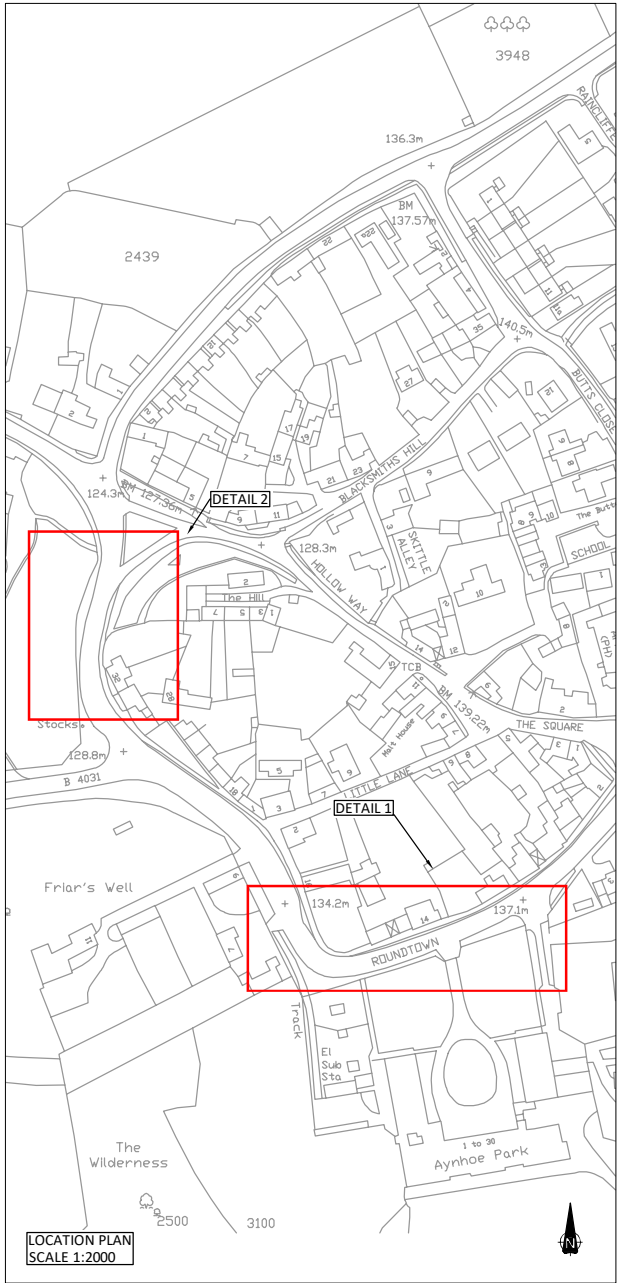
