It is thus our Tercentenary period and we will be using it to celebrate in the coming months and years – particularly if we manage to attract a new Rector back into the Parish after Reverend Sue's departure last summer.

The advertisement for a new Rector has been published again and we look forward to hearing some news by the middle of August. Please keep our situation in your prayers and also all those people trying to maintain the life of the Church during this difficult time.

PLAYING FIELD & PAVILION NEWS

"WELL BEING WALKS" (Thursday 10.00am)

Our weekly walks are always available, starting from the Sports Pavilion at 10.00 am each Thursday. As we are coming into the Summer, numbers will vary with people being on holiday and looking after grandchildren during school holiday periods but you will always find someone to walk with. A cuppa and a cake will be waiting when you return.

With the long periods of dry weather, we have to be careful of ridges and dips in the solid fields so please keep to your sturdy shoes. It is advisable to bring a bottle of water and carry antihistamine if you think you may be allergic to grasses or insect bites. The Blandford Fly is still making its mark in this area.

THE AYNHO CRICKET CLUB (ACC) was established earlier this year after a long absence of over 12 years of cricket being played on the Aynho Playing Field.

The ACC is a member of the ECB, the governing body of cricket in England & Wales, and the club's constitution follows the rules and guidelines of this governing body.

The ACC has two main objectives:

- 1. Is to facilitate an ECB All Stars programme to introduce cricket to children between the ages of 5-8. This has become an outstanding success this year with many girls and boys enjoying 45 plus minutes of coaching each Saturday morning an 8 week programme that commenced in mid-May.
- 2. Is to recommence senior (ages 15 upwards) cricket being played at Aynho. The club wishes to play competitive but friendly local cricket and does not wish to participate in any cricket leagues. This year we aim to play 4 or 5 matches and two have already been played during June against Fritwell and Souldern and we would expect to extend that to matches against Tusmore and Charlton.

The matches are friendly and competitive with cricket teas served between the 25 over innings with a BBQ afterwards. We have been very pleased to see so many villagers sitting down to watch play in the sunshine and then relax and enjoy a drink and a chat at the BBQ.

Every successful cricket club needs dedicated grounds staff and we could not have established this club without the coordinated help of fellow club members. Certain members of our club arrange to cut and prepare the wicket, the immediate square and the outfield all with great dedication and all of us help with wicket preparation using the heavy roller and the use of some sub contracted outfield maintenance.

We have sufficient playing members to field a cricket XI but we suspect there are many more villagers who love the game and who would like to watch it, support it or play it again even if they have not played for a while.

We would like to encourage both women and men to join the ACC by first coming to watch some of the matches and the All Star coaching events that start respectively at 2pm and at 10.00am on a Saturday. You can join as a playing or as a non-playing member and we also encourage company membership if there is a link to Aynho.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

To Aynho Residents from your Parish Council

Hello Villagers,

We thought you would like to know what your councillors have been doing on your behalf and where your money is being spent.

The Parish Council receives a precept of money to manage the village. A proportion of this comes from council tax. It roughly equates to less than £50 per household per year from council tax contributions. We also receive a little over £600 per year from West Northants County to manage our own grass cutting. We have the option to waiver this amount and they would cut the grass twice a year only.

With this amount of money, we provide grass cutting, weedkiller spray around the village, vital tree work in conservation areas, hedge trimming in designated conservation areas and all village maintenance. This year we have also replaced the Play Park fencing.

In order to budget money efficiently, some areas are cut more frequently than others. This saved money and helped the bio diversity with wildlife. We are aware this hasn't been well received by all and we are looking into the possibility of increasing the number of cuts per year.

No Mow May

Rather than leave the whole village uncut for 5 weeks, we reduced the number of cuts and left some smaller areas uncut. This hasn't been a popular decision and we have listened to your concerns and will not be complying with *No Mow May* next year. Mr Flint and his team are due to return again on 3rd July.

Village Maintenance

At present, we do not have a contractor to carry out maintenance work around the village. Currently, this has been undertaken by husband and me free of charge. This includes maintenance on the Village Hall and Pavilion as well as numerous maintenance tasks around the village including cutting back the bushes at the bottom of Blacksmith Hill to improve visibility at the road junction. This area is not the responsibility of the Parish Council, but we felt for safety reasons, it was indeed necessary. We are currently looking into employing someone to help with many of these tasks in the near future.

Street cleaning, road and pathway repairs are not our responsibility but we are happy to report any issues on Street Doctor on your behalf, or you can report any concerns to West Northants Council.

Restoration Hardware UK

The other big topic of conversation around the Village is RH. Restoration Hardware UK opened to the public on Friday 9th June. **www.rh.com**

If you have not paid them a visit yet, we recommend you do. It is a stunning building with some beautiful features and obviously glorious grounds you can wander through.

The House and Gallery are open to all. It is open Monday to Saturday 11.00 to 6.00pm and Sundays 11.00 to 5.00pm, the restaurant's last booking is 8.00pm, Monday to Saturday and 5.00pm on a Sunday.

There are several places you can stop by to have a drink, a tea lounge, a juice bar, a wine bar, an outdoor pizza restaurant and a fine dining restaurant. The food options need to be booked in advance.

Councillor Grant is in regular contact with RH. Although we are anticipating an increased volume initially, we are assured by the Management of RH they are taking the traffic issue and parking very seriously.

All visitors cars will be Valet parked in their own car park.

We are looking into purchasing residents' parking stickers for all villagers to display in their cars so we can identify resident's cars and manage nonresident's cars accordingly.

The launch party, which was a one off, as we all know, caused a traffic issue and was dangerous at times. RH has accepted all of your feedback and is very apologetic about how the events team they hired dealt with this. This will not happen again.

Speed Watch

We are also aware of the increased number of Speeding traffic coming through our village and we are trying to manage the situation best we can. We have purchased VAR cameras to encourage those speeding to slow down.

Councillor Dean arranged for the Community Speed Watch camera to be in the village from 27th May until 24th June. Vehicles caught speeding over 34mph were reported to Police. (See below for report and numbers.) We would like to thank those that have come forward and help make our village safer.

Our next Parish Council meeting is on July 3rd at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.
